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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ESTABLISHING GUIDELINES

APPLICABLE TO ANY WILD BUFFALO OR BISON MANAGEMENT PLAN

IMPLEMENTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH, WILDLIFE, AND PARKS: 6

REVISING THE PENALTY AND RESTITUTION PROVISIONS APPLICABLE

TO WILD BISON AND BUFFALO: AMENDING SECTIONS 87-1-102 AND

9 87-1-111, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

12 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Implementation of wild buffalo 13 management policy. As part of any policy applied to the management of wild buffalo or bison that enter Montana, the 15 department may:

- (1) not allow the permanent or seasonal establishment of wild buffalo or bison in Montana:
- (2) grant kill permits to private landowners or other persons as the result of a threat of disease or damage to persons or property;
- (3) contract with federally recognized Indian tribes for the establishment of disease-free wild buffalo or bison within the exterior boundaries of an Indian reservation; and
- 24 (4) in cooperation with the department of livestock, 25 charge the national park service for any costs incurred by

either department as the result of management of the 1 Yellowstone national park herd in Montana, including costs for damages to persons or property or the spread of disease 3 to Montana persons or livestock.

Section 2. Section 87-1-102, MCA, is amended to read:

*87-1-102. Penalties. (1) A person violating any provision of this title, any other state law pertaining to fish and game, or the orders or rules of the commission or department is, unless a different punishment is expressly provided by law for the violation, quilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not less than \$50 or more than \$500, imprisoned in the county jail for not more than 6 months, or both. In addition, the person shall be subject to forfeiture of his license and privilege to hunt, fish, or trap within this state for a period of not less than 24 months from the date of conviction.

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(2) (a) A person convicted of unlawfully taking, killing, possessing, transporting, or wasting of a bighorn sheep, moose, wild-bison; caribou, mountain goat, or grizzly bear or any part of these animals shall be fined not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000, imprisoned in the county jail for not more than 6 months, or both. In addition, that person shall forfeit any current hunting, fishing, or trapping license issued by this state and the privilege to hunt, fish, or trap in this state for not less than 30 LC 1537/01

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months from the date of conviction.

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- (b) A person convicted of unlawfully taking, killing, possessing, or transporting a deer, antelope, elk, mountain lion, or black bear or any part of these animals or wasting a deer, antelope, or elk shall be fined not less than \$300 or more than \$1,000, imprisoned in the county jail for not more than 6 months, or both. In addition, that person shall forfeit any current hunting, fishing, or trapping license issued by this state and the privilege to hunt, fish, or trap in this state for not less than 24 months from the date of conviction.
- (c) A person convicted of unlawfully attempting to trap, take, shoot, or kill a game animal shall be fined not less than \$200 or more than \$600, imprisoned in the county jail for not more than 60 days, or both.
- (d) A person convicted of unlawfully taking, killing, possessing, transporting, shipping, labeling, packaging, or wasting or unlawfully attempting to take, kill, or possess any game bird, wild turkey, or fish or any part of any such bird or fish or of failure to tag a game animal or game bird as prescribed by law shall be fined not less than \$50 or more than \$200 or imprisoned in the county jail for not more than 30 days, or both.
- (e) A person convicted of purposely or knowingly 24 25 taking, killing, possessing, transporting, shipping,

- labeling, or packaging a fur-bearing animal or pelt of a fur-bearing animal in violation of any provision of this title shall be fined not less than \$50 or more than \$1,000
 - or imprisoned in the county jail for not more than 6 months.
- or both. In addition, that person shall forfeit any current
- license and the privilege to hunt, fish, or trap for not
- less than 24 months from the date of conviction and any
 - pelts possessed unlawfully must be confiscated.
- 9 (f) A person convicted of hunting, fishing, or trapping 10 while his license is forfeited or his privilege denied shall 11 be imprisoned in the county jail for not less than 5 days or 12 more than 6 months. In addition, that person may be fined 13 not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000.
- 14 (3) A person convicted or who has forfeited bond or bail under subsection (2) and who has been ordered to pay 16 restitution under the provisions of 87-1-111 may not apply 17 for any special license under Title 87, chapter 2, part 7, 18 or enter any drawing for a special license or permit for a period of 5 years following the date of conviction or restoration of license privileges, whichever is later. 20
- 21 (4) Notwithstanding the provision of subsection (1), 22 the penalties provided by this section shall be in addition to any penalties provided in Title 37, chapter 47, and Title 23 87, chapter 4, part 2." 24
- 25 **Section 3.** Section 87-1-111, MCA, is amended to read:

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*87-1-111. (Temporary) Restitution for illegal killing or possession of certain wildlife. (1) In addition to other penalties provided by law, a person convicted or forfeiting bond or bail upon a charge of the illegal killing or possession of a wild bird, mammal, or fish listed in this section shall reimburse the state for each such bird, mammal, or fish according to the following schedule:

- 6 (a) bighorn sheep, mountain goat, caribou, buffalo;
 9 grizzly bear, moose, and endangered species, \$1,000;
- 10 (b) elk, mountain lion, black bear, lynx, and ll wolverine, \$500;
- (c) deer, antelope, fisher, raptor, swan, bobcat,
 pallid and white sturgeon, and paddlefish, \$300;
 - (d) grayling and furbearers not listed in subsection
 (1)(a), (1)(b), or (1)(c), \$100;
 - 16 (e) game bird (except swan), \$25;
 - 17 (f) game fish, \$10.

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18 (2) When a court enters an order declaring bond or bail 19 to be forfeited, the court may also order that some or all of the forfeited bond or bail be paid as restitution to the 20 21 state according to the schedule in subsection (1). A hearing 22 to determine the amount of restitution, as required under 23 46-9-504, is not required for an order of restitution under 24 this section. In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB0439, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act establishing guidelines applicable to any wild buffalo or bison management plan implemented by the Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks and revising the penalty and restitution provisions applicable to wild buffalo and bison.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. It is not known if contracting with Indian tribes would result in any additional costs to the department.
- 2. Since 1986, FWP expenditures for controlling the bison exceeded revenue by \$110,000. The interim management plan developed this winter calls for auctioning calves and some meat from adult bison to generate additional revenue.
- 3. Under the provisions of SB0439, FWP would bill Yellowstone National Park for <u>future</u> costs of controlling the bison. However, SB0439 does not require the federal government to reimburse the state, and the amount to be recovered, if any, is unknown.
