A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA TO APPOINT DELEGATES TO THE WESTERN STATES LEGISLATIVE FORESTRY TASK FORCE.

WHEREAS, the forests of the western states play a vital role in the economic development of these states; and

WHEREAS, there is an obvious need for developing means to protect and foster these forests to maximize yield while protecting the resource for future generations; and

WHEREAS, proper forest management and use are necessary for the protection and conservation of other important resources, such as wildlife, recreation, and scenic beauty; and

WHEREAS, the subjects that require interstate cooperation include but are not limited to insect infestations, conservation, production, and marketing, all of which know no state boundaries.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

That the Committee on Committees of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives appoint,

respectively, two Senators and two Representatives, one from each party, to represent Montana on the Western States Legislative Forestry Task Force, which operates as a clearinghouse for opinions from all the various interests involved in the forests of the western states and which includes among its duties a report to the Legislatures of the participating states and to those states' delegations in the United States Congress concerning means of protecting and fostering the forests of the participating states.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives send copies of this resolution to the presiding officers of the Legislatures of Washington, Idaho, Oregon, Wyoming, Alaska, and California and to the Executive Director of the Western States Legislative Forestry Task Force.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A joint resolution of the Senate and the House of Representatives to appoint delegates to the Western States Legislative Forestry Task Force.


ASSUMPTIONS:


1. All four legislators appointed to the task force will attend all meeting of the task force at the rate of four meeting for each year of the 1993 biennium.
2. Legislator salary of \$60.24 per day will be paid to each legislator for four days per meeting.
3. Legislator per diem will be paid to each legislator for four days per meeting.
4. Travel expenses for each legislator are estimated to be \$425 per meeting. This expense would not be applicable if any meetings are held in Montana.
5. No registration fee will be charged for any task force meeting.
6. Montana will pay full dues to the organization at the rate of \$2,750 per year.
7. The executive budget request for the Legislative Council Interim Studies and Conferences Program contains \$20,000 for the biennium for regional conference; however, no amount is specifically allocated for this particular task force.
