4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF
5	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REQUESTING AN
6	INTERIM STUDY ON THE LIQUOR LICENSE QUOTA SYSTEM; AND
7	REQUIRING A REPORT OF THE FINDINGS OF THE STUDY TO THE 53RD
8	LEGISLATURE.

10	WHEREAS, the liquor license quota system in Montana is
11	based on population; and
12	WHEREAS, some areas in the state have more licensed
13	establishments than are needed, while the demand for
14	licensed establishments in growing areas exceeds the supply
15	of licenses; and
16	WHEREAS, the current licensing procedure is complex,
17	burdensome, expensive, and subjective; and
18	WHEREAS, a liquor license, once issued, becomes the
19	personal property of the holder and may be used as
20	collateral for loans and sold for much more than the holder
21	paid for the license; and
22	WHEREAS, the liquor license quota system is inimical to
23	the operation of a free market; and
24	WHEREAS, there may be constitutional challenges to the
25	liquor license quota system because of its inherent

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3	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
4	OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
5	(1) That an appropriate interim committee be assigned
6	to study the liquor license quota system.
7	(2) That the committee in its study:
8	(a) evaluate the criteria, methods, and costs for
9	issuing a liquor license under the current system;
10	(b) consider alternatives to the current system;
11	(c) assess the costs to the state of implementing a new
12	system of liquor licensing; and
13	(d) identify mechanisms for reimbursing current license
14	holders for the loss in economic value of licenses if a new
15	system were adopted.
16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the interim committee
17	report the findings of the study to the 53rd Legislature and
18	present options for legislative consideration if the
19	committee determines that options are necessary.
