WHEREAS, since adoption of HJR 22 in 1989, the urgency 4 for realizing the benefits sought for Upper Missouri Basin 5 increased significantly because of a has states 6 deteriorating water supply infrastructure, severe drought, 7 from irrigation and recreational increasing demands R 9 interests, complex federally reserved water rights questions, and limited funding to meet increased demands for 10 11 Missouri River water; and

12 WHEREAS, to better coordinate and facilitate the goals
13 expressed in EJR 22, a broad-based Montana Pick-Sloan
14 Advisory Committee was formed by the Department of Natural

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE 1 2 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 3 That the Legislature endorse the strategies embodied in the Montana Pick-Sloan Initiative, including to: 4 5 (1) seek congressional authorizations and appropriations; 6 7 (2) create long-term sources of revenue to fund water projects; 8 9 (3) revise the operation of the Missouri River by the 10 United States Army Corps of Engineers; and (4) develop cost-sharing arrangements. 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution and copies of the Montana Pick-Sloan Initiative be sent to 13 each member of Montana's Congressional Delegation, the 14 15 President of the United States Senate, the United States Department of Interior--Bureau of Reclamation, and the 16 17 United States Army Corps of Engineers.
