JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1 INTRODUCED BY Jacobson Thomas 3 A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REQUESTING THAT AN 6 INTERIM COMMITTEE BE ESTABLISHED TO STUDY MANDATED HEALTH 7 INSURANCE BENEFITS; AND REQUIRING A REPORT TO THE 53RD 8 LEGISLATURE. 9 10 WHEREAS, the cost of health insurance continues to rise: 11 and 12 WHEREAS, a growing number of Montana citizens are unable 13 to afford health insurance and, thus, do not have insurance; 14 and 15 WHEREAS, many small business owners cannot afford health 16 insurance for themselves or their employees because the cost 17 is prohibitive; and 18 WHEREAS, legislation is proposed each session to mandate 19 that health insurers provide additional health care benefits 20 in their policies of insurance; and 21 WHEREAS, proponents of mandated health insurance 22 benefits argue that mandated benefits decrease the cost of 23 health insurance or improve access to needed health care 24 coverage or services; and

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aroue that mandated benefits increase the cost of health insurance and limit access to needed coverage and services; 2 3 WHEREAS. the Legislature should review the effects of 4 mandated health insurance benefits and the need for mandated benefits. 6 7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE 8 9 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: That an interim committee be established to study 10 mandated health insurance benefits. 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that as part of its study, the 1.3 committee: 14 (1) review existing mandated health insurance benefits 15 and proposed new benefits; (2) evaluate the costs and benefits of mandated health 16 17 insurance benefits, including proposed new benefits; 18 (3) determine the extent to which existing and proposed 19 mandated benefits are available and desired by the people of 20 Montana; 21 (4) prioritize, to the extent possible, the need for 2.3 existing mandated benefits and proposed new benefits; and 23 (5) consider alternatives to the present system of

mandated health insurance benefits.
