HEARING ON HOUSE BILL 789

"AN ACT ACCEPTING THE POWER-TOBIN MANSION AS THE LEGISLATURE'S CENTENNIAL GIFT TO THE CITIZENS OF THE STATE OF MONTANA, AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF THE EXISTING GOVERNOR'S MANSION; PROVIDING THAT PROCEEDS OF THE SALE BE USED FOR RENOVATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE POWER-TOBIN MANSION; AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS TO DEFRAY RECORDING COSTS."

Presentation and Opening Statement by Sponsor:

Representative Connelly, House District 8, Kalispell, and Chief Sponsor of House Bill 789, said she felt this was something that they should not lose, and was something worth doing. She said the bill has \$2 in for recording the deed. She said they could sell the present mansion and set up a fund for maintenance, and there was a group of private individuals who are raising money for wiring and plumbing, etc. She said they have also started with plans for putting a reception room on the back.

Testifying Proponents and Who They Represent:

Proponent Testimony:

(042) Mr. Mitchell said Secretary of State Cooney made a proposal to the Land Board similar to the bill before you, and we have done a lot of research on the question. General Services has had a chance to look at the building and have come up with some numbers. There are some

comparative maintenance figures available, zoning papers will be coming from the city, etc. He said they felt this was a good project and was available for any questions.

Representative Bardanouve said he and Senator Blaylock at the beginning of the session had proposed to take over the mansion by a joint resolution. He said the Governor had poured cold water on them, and they had not continued with the effort. He said the architects and engineers office had suggested about \$150,000 for renovation and there would be some maintenance. The room for receptions has been added since then. He said he felt this was a very worth while purpose.

Questions From Committee Members: Representative Marks said he would support the bill if some changes were made to it. He said he felt it is inappropriate to sell the Governor's house out from under him. Mr. Cooney and the Board of Examiners are looking at it, and said he felt they should be content to let them do so. Rep. Bardanouve said he would agree with Rep. Marks in regard to selling the mansion. He said there have been some suggestions that this could be an office facility.

Rep. Grady said he had heard the Governor or the Lieutenant Governor would have to live in this house, that it couldn't be turned into an office. Rep. Swift asked if it was correct that they had to be in resident for 25 years in there, and Rep. Bardanouve said he was not sure what all the provisions were.

Discussion was held (122) on the pro's and con's of taking the mansion, how the agreement might be broken, possibilities for the use of the present Governor's mansion, protective covenants, etc.

Closing by Sponsor: (163) She said she had talked to the Governor yesterday, and he said in order to get his approval they would have to get about \$150,000 to do the work that would have to be done. She said she told him she would have a meeting of the Long Range Committee and we could find the money in there. He said he really didn't have any objection to the building, but was concerned about the size of the entertainment area. He said at the present time we have a group raising the money to remodel the Tobin Mansion.

Representative Bardanouve declared the hearing closed, and Rep.

Connelly said they had not put some amendments on her House Bill 543 the other day.

Amendments, Discussion, and Votes: Motion by Representative Spaeth to accept the amendments EXHIBIT 1. He also explained the amendments. Voted, passed.

Motion: Motion by Representative Connelly that House Bill 543 do pass as amended.

Recommendation and Vote: Voted, passed, Representatives Grinde and Bardanouve voting no.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 735

Motion: Motion by Representative Marks, do pass.

Substitute Motion: Substitute Motion by Representative Peck to table House Bill 735.

Discussion: Rep. Peck said he felt it was premature to put this motion in place. The equalization program will include a study dealing with the capital account for school districts. He said he did not feel the timing is appropriate at this point.

Amendments, Discussion, and Votes: None

Recommendation and Vote: Vote on substitution motion to table House Bill 735 was voted. passed, 5 members voting no.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 755

Motion: Motion by Rep. Swift to table House Bill 769.

Recommendation and vote: Voted, failed, on a tie vote.

Amendments, Discussion, and Votes: Motion: by Representative Kadas (308) to amend by striking \$100,000 out of the bill.

Substitute Motion: Substitute Motion by Representative Marks to strike the entire appropriation.

Representative Cody asked what would happen if the entire appropriation were struck, and Representative Marks said it means the administration of the University will do what we tell them to do.

Recommendation and Vote: Voted, passed, roll call vote, 14 yes, 6 no.

Motion: Motion by Representative Kadas, do pass as amended.

Recommendation and Vote: Voted, Passed, Unanimous vote.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 770

Motion: Motion by Representative Menahan that House Bill 770 do pass.

Discussion: (383) Discussion was held on the cost of the bill at about \$160 million as it is, Rep. Menahan said there was a hearing in the pay plan committee, but this bill never heard the bill or worked with it. He said he did not feel there had been a fair hearing of the bill. Rep. Bardanouve pointed out that each session there is a pay plan committee and they were given the bill to study. Rep. Quilici said the recommended action of the subcommittee was to table the bill with one descending vote.

Recommendation and Vote: Voted, failed, 7 members voting yes.

Motion: Motion by Representative Spaeth that House Bill 770 be tabled.

Amendments, Discussion, and Votes: None

Recommendation and Vote: Vote on motion that House Bill 770 be tabled, passed. (Reverse vote)

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 780

Motion: Motion by Representative Grady to adopt amendments. EXHIBITS 1 and 2.

Discussion: Rep. Marks asked, if the amendments were passed, this bill would have to have an immediate effective date.

Representative Grady said he felt this bill might bring the bill closer to solvency. Rep. Spaeth asked if the bill as

amended would need a statement of intent.

Recommendation: Voted, passed, unanimous vote.

Motion: Motion by Representative Grady to move the amount down to \$200,000.

There was discussion on the amount of money involved in the bill, and it was stated the interest will now go back into the account. (500)

Recommendation: Voted, passed.

Motion: Motion by Representative Marks that House Bill 780 be amended to have an immediate effective date.

Recommendation: Voted, passed.

Motion: Motion by Representative Bradley that House Bill 780, as amended, do pass.

Recommendation and Vote: Voted, passed. Roll call vote, 11 yes, 9 no.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 781

Motion: Motion by REpresentative Spaeth that House Bill 781 be tabled.

Discussion: None

Amendments, Discussion, and Votes: None

Recommendation and Vote: Voted, passed, 7 members voting no.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 784

Motion: Motion by Representative Nisbet that House Bill 784 be amended on line 11 by striking \$150,000 and inserting \$120,000. , and on lines 12 and 13 strike "Board of Public Education" and insert "Montana School for the Deaf and Blind".

Discussion: Chairman Bardanouve said he had one concern, we have teachers at Miles City, at Mountain View, and some at Boulder, and those teachers will not be treated the same. Rep. Marks asked if this passes and considering the pay plan already passed, would this go on top of that raise? Rep. Nisbet answered yes.

Amendments, Discussion, and Votes: Vote was taken on Representative Nisbet's amendment. Voted, passed.

Motion: Motion by Rep. Nisbet that House Bill 784 do pass as amended.

Discussion: Rep. Marks said the \$150,000 would have provided about a 24% increase. He felt this was a little out of line with what some of the teachers had in some of the other areas. Rep. Peck said he would have to agree with Rep. Marks. Rep. Cody said they had passed a piece of legislation to give these people more money, and it was her understanding that they did not get the increase last session that was passed. Rep. Menahan said the Institutions people did not get the raise. Mr. Sunstead said all the teachers got the increase with the exception of Pine Hills School. MSDB also got the raise, and the reason Pine Hills did not is because they have not signed a collective bargaining agreement, and the law says not until one is signed. REp. Marks asked, without this bill, where are the teachers compared to the others and Mr. Sunstead answered, without the pay plan, the starting salary would be about \$1500, and the top end would be about \$3,000.

Recommendation and Vote: Motion that House Bill 784, as amended, do pass, Vote failed.

Motion: Motion by Rep. Spaeth that House Bill 784 be tabled.

Recommendation and Vote: Requested to reverse previous vote. Motion passed.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 785

Motion: Motion by Representative Spaeth that House Bill 785 be tabled.

Tape 1, side B, 000.

Recommendation: Voted, failed, roll call vote, 6 yes, 13 no.

Motion: Motion by Representative Swysgood to amend page 2 following line 8, EXHIBIT 1.

Recommendation: Voted, passed, roll call vote, 15 yes, 5 no.

Motion: Motion by Representative Thoft to amend the Galen project and the Eastern Montana Veterans' home into this bill. He said the numbers could be taken from 202.

Discussion: There was some discussion on the pro's and con's of the amendment, and whether this could be added to the bill without changing the title. It was suggested, to just strike the University System. Rep. Bradley commented that the committee was handling this wrong, that this should have gone through the Long Range Planning committee.

Amendments, Discussion, and Votes: Voted, Roll call vote, failed, 9 yes, 11 no.





Dear Representative Darko:

The fund balance in the Junk Vehicle special revenue account is invested as part of the short-term investment pool managed by the Board of Investments. The Board of Investments does not maintain data on the investment earnings associated with each special revenue account.

We developed an approximation of the interest that has been earned on the balance in the Junk Vehicle account by estimating the earnings on the average fund balance in each of the last ten years. This estimate is presented in Table 1. The average fund balance is the average of the beginning and ending balance in each fiscal year. The average yield is the average yield for the short-term investment pool as reported by the Board of Investments.


