#### EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HB 1005

Motion: REP. DRISCOLL moved to amend HB 1005. EXHIBIT 1

#### Discussion:

REP. DRISCOLL said the amendments include a training program for the inmates. Page 3, Lines 3-5, says there will be a ratio of one journeyman for every two inmates. Page 4, the new section, describes the projects in HB 5 that the prisoners will build. The inmates would get true training in the construction industry. When the inmates are released from prison, they would at least have some knowledge of construction and could possibly get a job

in that field. The last time prison labor was used there was no training. The inmates were used for the "bull" work. They didn't learn anything; it was a way to get cheap labor.

REP. BENEDICT asked REP. DRISCOLL how amendment No. 5 relates to the \$1.5 million. How much of that would be used for the construction of the gymnasium, yard storage, toilet, landscaping, etc? REP. DRISCOLL said the list contains every project that was asked for. It is the full list that was given to him by the Department Institutions for the projects in HB 5. REP. BENEDICT said the amendment narrows the bill to make sure that prison labor will be used for those projects only. REP. DRISCOLL said yes.

Ms. McClure said it is limited to the projects approved by the Legislature, which are contained in amendment No. 5. They are in excess of \$25,000 and are in the long-range building program.

REP. DRISCOLL said the present law allows prison labor to be used on projects that cost \$25,000 or less. The bill would expand it to include the list of projects in Amendment No. 5, which cost more than \$25,000. REP. BENEDICT asked REP. DRISCOLL if he had discussed the amendments with Curt Chisholm. REP. DRISCOLL said he discussed the original set of amendments and also tried to insert an amendment where the architects and engineers would have to use some prisoners, possibly in the layout and drafting of the blueprints. They weren't sure the school of architecture would agree to it, so that amendment was withdrawn. Mr. Chisholm isn't 100 percent in favor of the amendments, but agrees there will be some training and not just work-camp jobs. REP. BENEDICT asked if Mr. Chisholm indicated that the training program would decrease the savings. REP. DRISCOLL said he didn't discuss it with Mr. Chisholm exactly. Through Prison Industries there is training in different fields, including furniture manufacturing, woodwork, etc. They screen all prisoners for their experience prior to going to prison. With the amendment, the classification officer will screen the people that have had some experience in the construction industry, and those prisoners would be selected for the training positions. He didn't know how much it would This proposal would be similar to what was done on the last prison bill, which was the construction of the 96-bed housing unit.

Vote: HB 1005 AMENDMENTS. Motion carried unanimously.
