
## 3rd Quarter 2014 Highlights

- \* Time to disposition for Direct Appeals has increased by 6 days over Quarter 2 of 2014.
- \* Time to disposition for Original Proceedings has decreased by 11 days over Quarter 2 of 2014.
- \* Case clearance rates have increased slightly over Quarter 2 of 2014. Rates went from an 83% clearance to a 92% clearance with 204 cases being filed and 189 cases being closed in Quarter 2 of 2014.



### Direct Appeal Lifecycle - Median Days by Case Type

- Median Days from Notice of Appeal to Court
- Median Days from Date Sent to Court to Classification
- Median Days from Classification to Remittitur



Case Clearance: The ratio between the number of cases closed (outgoing) and the number of cases filed (incoming).

Manner of Disposition: The manner by which the Court disposes of its cases.

Age of Pending Cases: The age of the Court's active cases (does not include stayed cases).

Time to Disposition: The length of time (median days) it takes the Court to dispose of cases.
