

4th Quarter 2017 Highlights

- * Case Clearance Rates have increased to 116% over Q3 2017 with 138 cases filed and 161 cases closed.
- * Time to Disposition for Original Proceedings dropped from 182 days in Q3 to 46 days in Q4. While Time to Disposition for Direct Appeals increased slightly, by 20 days in Q4 over Q3.

Direct Appeal Lifecycle - Median Days by Case Type

- Median Days from Notice of Appeal to Court
- Median Days from Date Sent to Court to Classification
- Median Days from Classification to Remittitur



Case Clearance: The ratio between the number of cases closed (outgoing) and the number of cases filed (incoming). Manner of Disposition: The manner by which the Court disposes of its cases.

Age of Pending Cases: The age of the Court's active cases (does not include stayed cases). Time to Disposition: The length of time (median days) it takes the Court to dispose of cases.
