On August 28, 2024, the Defendant was sentenced for a period of eight (8) years to the Department of Corrections, with five (5) years suspended, for the offense of <u>Count II</u>: Criminal Child Endangerment, a Felony, in violation of §45-5-628(1)(d), MCA. The Court recommended the Defendant placed in Connections Corrections or NEXUS followed by Pre-Release.

The Defendant was given credit for time served for the following date ranges: July 9, 2023 – July 13, 2023; August 24, 2023 – September 5, 2023; January 18, 2024 – February 21, 2024; April 10, 2024 – April 23, 2024; and July 17, 2024 – August 28, 2024.

On February 6, 2025, the Defendant's Application for review of that sentence came on for hearing by Zoom videoconference before the Sentence Review Division of the Montana Supreme Court (hereafter "the Division"). The Defendant appeared from the Missoula Pre-Release Center and was represented by Tyler Dugger, Defense Counsel. The State was represented by Daniel Baris. The Defendant did not provide a statement.

Before hearing the Application, the Defendant was advised that the Division has the authority not only to reduce the sentence or affirm it, but also increase it. The Defendant was further advised that there is no appeal from a decision of the Division. The Defendant acknowledged that he understood this and stated that he wished to proceed.

Rule 12, Rules of the Sentence Review Division of the Supreme Court of Montana, provides that, "The sentence imposed by the District Court is presumed correct. The sentence shall

not be reduced or increased unless it is clearly inadequate or clearly excessive." (Section 46-18-904(3), MCA).

The Division finds that the reasons advanced for modification are insufficient to hold that the sentence imposed by the District Court is clearly inadequate or clearly excessive.

Therefore, it is the unanimous decision of the Division that the sentence is AFFIRMED.
