County Division Apportionment of Property. Jails. Bridges.

Jails situated in the new county must be considered in making apportionments and reductions of indebtedness of the old county.

County Bridges in either the old or new county are a part of the public highways and should not be considered in making apportionments or reductions of the indebtedness between the old and new county.
