Second Grade Certificates. Registration and Use of.

The provisions of Sec. 905, Chap. 76, Laws 1913. apply to second grade certificates issued prior to March 12th, 1913, as well as to those issued subsequent to that date.

Dear Sir:

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your inquiry under date of October 13th, 1913, submitting for my opinion the following question:

"Whether second grade county certificates issued prior to March 12th, 1913, can be registered and used in another county than the one in which they were issued?"

I have examined the provision in question and compared it with that portion of the Revised $Code_S$, Sec. 958, which it supplanted and find that the subjects required in the new law are virtually the same as those which were required under Sec. 958, with the exception that the new law omits the requirement of physical geography and mental arithmetic.

The new law, Sec. 905 of Chap. 76 of the Session Laws of the Thirteenth Legislative Assembly, is general in its terms, and there is nothing to indicate that the provision in regard to the registration of second grade certificates should be confined to those issued subsequent to March 12th, 1913. You are, therefore, advised that the provisions of this chapter apply as well to second grade certificates iss..ed prior to March 12th, 1913, as to those issued subsequent to that date.
