Stallion Registration Board. Fee for Examination and Enrollment. Registration, of Stallions, Fee for.

But one fee is required for one examination of stallion, and the owner is not liable for the payment of another fee until his horse has been examined.

Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter of the 14th instant, submitting the question:

"Where an owner has paid the fee for registration enrollment, but the examination has not been had, must the owner at the expiration of the four-year period pay another fee for such examination?"

The law requires but one fee to be paid for one examination, and when the owner has once paid that fee he is not liable for its repayment until his horse has been examined and such examination then dates from the day it is made. An examination nunc pro tunc cannot be made.
