CORPORATIONS — School board, incorporation of, not permitted; SCHOOLS AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS — School board incorporation, not permitted. Article X, section 8, Constitution of Montana; sections 75-5933 and 75-5934, R.C.M. 1947.

HELD: A district school board may not incorporate under the Montana Nonprofit Corporation Act.

Dear Mr. Brooks:

You have requested my opinion as to whether a district school board may incorporate under the Montana Nonprofit Corporation Act, section 15-2301, et seq., R.C.M. 1947. The Montana Constitution, Article X, section 8, provides:

The supervision and control of schools in each school district shall be vested in a board of trustees to be elected as provided by law.

A school district is a political subdivision and instrumentality of the state. Teamsters, Chauffeurs, Warehousemen and Helpers, Local #45 v. Cascade County School Dist. #1, 30 St. Rptr. 630. Montana law at section 75-5901, Revised Codes of Montana, 1947, defines trustees as the governing board of a school district. However, school board trustees have only those powers expressed or implied by law. McNair v. School Dist. No. 1 of Cascade County, 87 Mont. 423, 288 P. 188.

The general powers and duties of school board trustees are set out in sections 75-5932, 75-5933 and 75-5934, R.C.M. 1947. These statutes neither expressly nor impliedly give school trustees the authority to incorporate.

THEREFORE, IT IS MY OPINION:

A district school board may not incorporate under the Montana Nonprofit Corporation Act.
