2 INTRODUCED BY RICHARDS, JOHNSON, MELOY

4 A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF
5 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REQUESTING THE
6 FEDERAL GOVERNMENT'S ENERGY POLICY MAKERS TO CONSIDER THE
7 NEEDS OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE AS WELL AS THE NEEDS OF ENERGY
8 SUPPLYING CORPORATIONS.

10 WHEREAS, corporations dealing in petroleum and other
11 fossil fuels have been known to contribute large amounts of
12 money to various state and national political campaigns, and

13 WHEREAS, various national administrations have been
14 known to appoint numerous fossil fuel industry executives to
15 decision-making positions, especially regarding national
16 energy policy; and

17 WHEREAS, these appointees have considerable influence
18 in shaping the energy policies of the United States; and

19 WHEREAS, the energy policy of the United States has
20 been more rapid development of fossil fuels, at the expense
21 of several "national sacrifice areas"; and

22 WHEREAS, the energy policy of the United States has not
23 provided adequately for the consideration of ENERGY
24 CONSERVATION AND/OR alternative energy sources; and

25 WHEREAS, the energy policy of the United States has

1 provided little restraint to the profiteering by fossil fuel
2 corporations at the expense of the American economy and the
3 American consumer.

5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
6 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

7 That the government of the United States of America is
8 respectfully requested to consider the interests of all the
9 American people, not just the fossil fuel corporations, in
10 formulating national energy policy.

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution
12 be mailed to ~~the--Montana--congressional-delegation~~ EVERY
13 MEMBER OF THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS, the director of the
14 Energy Research and Development Administration, the
15 Secretary of the Interior, and the President of the United
16 States.
