13 WHEREAS, Montana could potentially receive
14 transboundary environmental and socioeconomic impacts from
15 Cabin Creek coal development in Canada; and

16 WHEREAS, impacts to Montana could be significant in the
17 North Fork Flathead River drainage if adequate safeguards
18 are not taken; and

19 WHEREAS, the Montana portion of the North Fork Flathead
20 River is regarded as a relatively pristine river and forms
21 the western boundary of the Glacier National Park; and

22 WHEREAS, the Montana portion of the North Fork Flathead
23 River has been adopted under the national wild and scenic
24 river system; and
