Sections 406 and 407 not repealed. Section 311 amended by the laws of 1899, p. 94, and such amendment by implication amends Section 313. Sections 310 to 314, inclusive, as amended, are not in conflict with Section 2384, Political Code.

Dear Madam:—In reply to your request, received some time ago, for an opinion on certain sections of the Political Code we respectfully submit the following:

Section 406 and 407 of the Political Code have not been repealed. Section 310 has not been repealed. Section 311 was amended by the laws of 1899, p. 94, and as amended, provides that

“No report of state officers or boards shall hereafter be printed or published oftener than once in two years which shall be in the month of December prior to the convening of the regular session of the Legislature, except by the order of the State Board of Examiners, and the number of copies of each report to be printed shall be determined by the State Board of Examiners.”

Section 312 is repealed by said law of 1899. Section 313 is still in force, except in so far as Section 311, as amended, where it is provided that the number of copies of reports shall be determined by the state board of examiners, amends it by implication. Section 314 has not been repealed. Sections 310 to 314, and amendments thereto, relate to the reports to be made to the governor and are not in conflict with Section 2384, which relates to the duty of the librarians of the law and historical libraries.
