

County Commissioners—Mileage.

County Commissioners are entitled to mileage only for each term of meeting of the Board.

Dear Sir:

I have your letter of January 28, 1919, submitting for an opinion the following question:

“Where a County Commissioner resides ten miles from the county seat, where the Board of County Commissioners meets in session each day, and such commissioner travels to and from the county seat each successive day in attending to his official work, is he entitled to collect mileage for the number of miles traveled each day?”

An opinion upon this same question was rendered by this office on August 6, 1914, and is found in Volume 5, Opinions of the Attorney General, at page 592. The rule there stated is that the allowance of mileage to County Commissioners is for the term of meeting of a board and that a County Commissioner is entitled to receive mileage once each way to and from his residence, for each session which he attends and no more.
