

Soldiers' Home—Admission—Ex-service Men.

Any person who served in any Indian campaign within the borders of the state is eligible to admission to the Soldiers' Home.

My dear Mr. White:

You have requested my opinion whether section 1535, R.C.M. 1921, as amended by chapter 60, laws of 1931, provides that all ex-service men who took part in any Indian campaign within the state of Montana are eligible to admission to the Soldiers' Home.

The above law provides in part as follows:

“or any person who served with the United States Army in the Campaign of 1890 and 1891 against the Sioux and Cheyenne Indians or other Indian campaigns within the borders of the State of Montana.”

In my opinion, this provision was intended to and does make eligible to admission to the Soldiers' Home of this state any person who served in any Indian campaign within the borders of the state.
