Treatment Provider: Advantages of Partnering with Drug Courts

- DC participants make treatment appointments

- Treatment expertise is highly valued by drug court team

- Sanctions/Recognition/Treatment Adjustments all support improved treatment outcomes
- Extensive communication with drug court team members
- Electronic communication allows treatment to be informed about participant issues
