Executive Order Creating a State Job Training Coordinating Council.

- WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Employment and Training Act will be repealed by the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) on October 1, 1983, and

WHEREAS, Section 122 of JTPA requires the Governor to establish a state Job Training Coordinating Council as a prerequisite for the state to receive funding under the Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TED SCHWINDEN, Governor of the State of Montana, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the laws and Constitution of the State of Montana, hereby create a state "Job Training Coordinating Council."

The Governor hereby designates Jerome C. Overmier as the nongovern-

mental person to chair the Council.

III. The Council shall:

Valley County

- 1. recommend a Governor's coordination and special services plan;
- recommend to the Governor substate service delivery areas, plan resource allocations not subject to Section 292(a) of JTPA, provide management guidance and review for all programs in the State, develop appropriate linkages with other programs, coordinate activities with private industry councils, and develop the Governor's coordination and special services plan and recommend variations in performance standards;
- 3. advise the Governor and local entities on job training plans and certify the consistency of such plans with criteria under the Governor's coordination and special services plan for coordination of activities under this Act with other Federal, State, and local employment-related programs, including programs operated in designated enterprise zones;
- 4. review the operation of programs conducted in each service delivery area, and the availability, responsiveness, and adequacy of State services, and make recommendations to the Governor, appropriate chief elected officials, and private industry councils, service providers, the State legislature, and the general public with respect of ways to improve the effectiveness of such programs or services;
- 5. review and comment on the State plan developed for the State employment service agency;
- 6. make an annual report to the Governor which shall be a public document, and issue such other studies, reports, or documents as it deems advisable to assist service delivery areas in carrying out the purposes of this Act;
- 7. identify, in coordination with the appropriate State agencies, the employment and training and vocational education needs throughout the State, and assess the extent to which employment and training, vocational education, rehabilitation services, public assistance, economic development, and other Federal, State, and local programs and services represent a consistent, integrated, and coordinated approach to meeting such needs;
- comment at least once annually on the reports required pursuant to Section 105(d)(3) of the Vocational Education Act of 1963; and

9. review plans of all State agencies providing employment, training, and related services, and provide comments and recommendations to the Governor, the State legislature, the State agencies, and the appropriate Federal agencies on the relevancy and effectiveness of employment and training and related service delivery systems in the State.

IV. Administering Agency

The Montana Department of Labor and Industry is hereby designated as the organizational unit responsible for oversight and management of statewide labor market information and as the state agency authorized to act on behalf of the Governor in the planning, administering, coordinating and oversight functions assigned to the Governor under the Job Training Partnership Act.

V. Effective Date of Order

This order is effective immediately.
