OF MONTANA

EXECUTIVE ORDER AMENDING AND CONTINUING AN ADVISORY COUNCIL
KNOWN AS THE MONTANA STATEHOOD CENTENNIAL COMMISSION

WHEREAS, Section 2-89-107 MCA requires the appointment of an advisory council to be known as the Montana Statehood Centennial Commission; and

WHEREAS, 2-15-122, MCA, allows for the creation of advisory councils and specifies the conditions under which they operate;

WHEREAS, the continuity of the Montana Statehood Centennial Commission is advisable and in the best interest of the state of Montana, this is especially true during the centennial year;

WHEREAS, adequate and appropriate geographic representation on the Commission is vital to advance the purpose of the Commission;

NOW, THEREFORE, I Stan Stephens, Governor of the State of Montana, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the laws and Constitution of the State of Montana, hereby continue the Montana Statehood Centennial Commission.

1. COMPOSITION AND TERMS OF APPOINTMENT.

The following persons shall continue to serve at the pleasure of the Governor as members of the Commission:

In accordance with state law, Lieutenant Governor Allen C. Kolstad shall serve as chair of the Commission and shall convene the Commission at appropriate intervals.

II. PURPOSE

The Commission shall furnish advice and make recommendations to the office on topics including but not limited to the following:

(a) the themes and criteria that apply to endorsing specific centennial projects;

(b) the criteria that apply in awarding grants to individuals and organizations, public or private, for activities in furtherance of centennial activities;

(c) ways to administer and encourage the commemoration of Montana's 100th anniversary of statehood on November 8, 1989, and to foster related activities prior to and after that date;

(d) ways to assure active citizen and community involvement, diversity in the presentation of topics, and balance in the examination of our past with expectations of the future;

(e) ways to focus national and international attention on Montana while reminding Montanans what Montana has been, is, and hopes to become.

(f) ways to integrate, whenever practicable, Montana's Centennial, with centennial celebrations and activities of neighboring states and provinces, since such other activities provide forums and opportunities for Montana's Centennial celebration.

III. ADMINISTERING AGENCY.

The Montana Statehood Centennial Office, in the Office of the Lt. Governor is the organizational unit responsible for oversight and management of the Montana Statehood Centennial Commission's activities and, as such, may convene such other advisory committees and task forces as may be necessary for special purposes in conjunction with Centennial activities.

IV. REPEAL OF PRIOR EXECUTIVE ORDERS.

Any Executive order entered prior to this date, including Executive Order No. 18-87, which is in conflict with the terms and conditions of this executive order is hereby repealed.

V. EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDER.

This order is effective immediately and shall exist until December 31, 1989.
