Executive Order No. 4-83

Executive Order Transferring the Function specified under S. 7 of Senate Bill 100 from the Department of Administration to the Department of Commerce.

WHEREAS, House Bill No. 639 (Chapter 287, Laws of Montana, 1983) was passed by the 48th Legislature and signed by me into law on March 29, 1983; and

WHEREAS, House Bill No. 639 transfers from the Department of Administration to the Department of Commerce the functions of generally assisting political subdivisions, exercising oversight of financial and reporting systems, supervising records retention, and performing audits; and

WHEREAS, Section 2 of House Bill No. 639 authorizes the Governor, by Executive Order, to assign to the Department of Commerce functions allocated to the Department of Administration by the 48th Legislature relating to local governments or political subdivisions; and

WHEREAS, Section 7 of Senate Bill No. 100, assigns to the Board of County Commissioners or the Department of Administration the duty, when examining the treasurer's report, to investigate if any persons are doing business in the county without a license or if the amount of the license is sufficient; and

WHEREAS, the function described in Section 7 of Senate Bill No. 100 is a function relating to local governments or political subdivisions.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ted Schwinden, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Article V, Section 4 of the Constitution of the State of Montana and Section 2 of House Bill No. 639, do hereby transfer the function assigned to the Department of Administration under Section 7 of Senate Bill No. 100 to the Department of Commerce.

This Order is effective immediately.
