EXECUTIVE ORDER CONTINUING THE ~~OF MONTANA~~  
EDUCATION ADVISORY COUNCIL

---

WHEREAS, Section 564(a)(2) of the Education Consolidation and Improvement Act of 1981, 20 U.S.C. 3814 (a)(2) requires continuing consultation between the Office of Public Instruction and an advisory council appointed by the Governor.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, STAN STEPHENS, Governor of the State of Montana, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the laws and Constitution of the State of Montana, do hereby continue the Education Advisory Council.

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of the Council shall be to advise the Superintendent of Public Instruction on implementation of Education and Consolidation Improvement Act programs in accordance with federal statutes. These advisory functions specifically include those listed in 20 U.S.C. 3814 (a)(2).



III. EFFECTIVE DATE AND DURATION OF ORDER


