EXECUTIVE ORDER CREATING THE
EDUCATION ADVISORY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, Section 564(a)(2) of the Education Consolidation and Improvement Act of 1981, 20 U.S.C. 3814(a)(2) requires continuing consultation between the Office of Public Instruction and an advisory council appointed by the Governor.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TED SCHWINDEN, Governor of the State of Montana, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the laws and Constitution of the State of Montana, do hereby create the Education Advisory Council.

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of the Council shall be to advise the Superintendent of Public Instruction on implementation of Education and Consolidation Improvement Act programs in accordance with federal statutes. These advisory functions specifically include those listed in 20 U.S.C. 3814(a)(2).


