Executive Order No. 12-75

RECEIVED
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Executive Order providing that the State Board of Crime Control shall undertake juvenile delinquency prevention and control planning under the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974 (Public Law 93-415).

WHEREAS, Congress has passed the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974 (Public Law 93-415) and;

WHEREAS, Juvenile delinquency constitutes a national and state problem which must be met by coordinated state, local government and private agency planning and action; and;

WHEREAS, The State Board of Crime Control is presently charged with and engaged in comprehensive law enforcement planning covering police, courts and corrections, requiring close coordination and interrelationship in planning with other agencies dealing with troubled youth; and;


WHEREAS, The Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974 provides funds for state and local governments to engage in planning and in action programs for the purpose of combating juvenile delinquency; and;

WHEREAS, The provisions of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974 require the governor of a state to designate an agency in order to qualify the state for receipt of federal and other grant funds;

THEREFORE, I, THOMAS L. JUDGE, Governor of the State of Montana, pursuant to the authority vested in me, designate the Board of Crime Control as the sole agency for comprehensive planning in juvenile delinquency prevention and control under Public Law 93-415.
