STATE OF MONTANA OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 12-85

EXECUTIVE ORDER APPOINTING MEMBERS TO AN ADVISORY COUNCIL TO BE KNOWN AS THE MONTANA STATEHOOD CONTENNIAL COMMISSION

WHEREAS, House Bill 873 (Chapter 664, Laws of Montana, 1985) creates a Montana Statehood Centennial Office and requires the appointment of an advisory council to be known as the Montana Statehood Centennial Commission (Commission); and

WHEREAS, 2-15-122, MCA, allows for the creation of advisory councils and specifies the conditions under which they operate;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TED SCHWINDEN, Governor of the State of Montana, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the laws and Constitution of the State of Montana, hereby appoint members of the Commission and specify its duties and relationship to Office.

I. COMPOSITION AND TERMS OF APPOINTMENT.

The following persons shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor as members of the Commission:

Chair.

In accordance with state law, Lieutenant Governor George Turman shall serve as chair of the Commission and shall convene the Commission at appropriate intervals.

II. THE COMMISSION SHALL:

Furnish advice and make recommendations to the office on topics including but not limited to the following:

- (a) the themes and criteria that apply to endorsing specific centennial projects;
- (b) the criteria that apply in awarding grants to individuals and organizations, public or private, for activities in furtherance of centennial activities;

(c) ways to administer and encourage the commemoration of Montana's 100th anniversary of statchood on November 8, 1989, and to foster related activities prior to and after that date;

(d) ways to assure active citizen and community involvement, diversity in the presentation of topics, and balance in the examination of our past with expectations of the future;

(e) ways to focus national and international attention on Montana while reminding Montanans of what Montana has been, is, and hopes to become;

(f) ways to integrate, whenever practicable, Montana's Centennial, with centennial celebrations and activities of neighboring states and provinces, since such other activities provide forums and opportunities for Montana's Centennial celebration.

III. <u>ADMINISTERING AGENCY</u>.

The Montana Statehood Centennial Office, in the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, is the organizational unit responsible for oversight and management of the Montana Statehood Centennial Commission's activities and, as such, may convene such other advisory committees and task forces as may be necessary for special purposes in conjunction with Centennial activities.

IV. EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDER.

This Order is effective 8/16/85 and shall exist until 9/1/87.
