Executive Order extending an Energy Supply Alert.

I, Thomas L. Judge, in accordance with powers granted to me as Governor by the laws and Constitution of the State of Montana, and in particular recognition of the provisions of Chapter 577, 1977 Session Laws of Montana (House Bill 762 of the 45th Legislature), do hereby find and declare that the energy supply alert continues to exist as to electrical energy in those areas of Montana shown on the accompanying map. This second energy supply alert will continue for a period of 90 days unless terminated earlier by executive order.

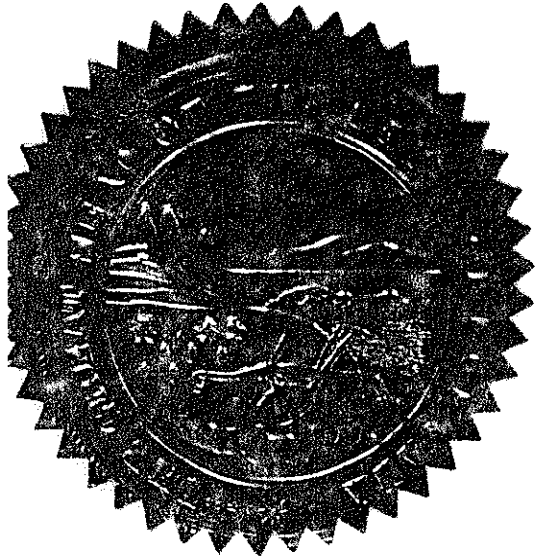
In my first declaration of an energy supply alert, I directed all state agencies and political subdivisions of the State located within the affected service areas to reduce their use of electricity by at least 10 per cent from their historic rate of use. I hereby order that this reduction in use be continued during this second energy supply alert.

The affected service areas are the areas served by:

Montana Power Company
Pacific Power and Light
Northern Lights, Incorporated
Lincoln Electric Cooperative
Flathead Irrigation Project
Flathead Electric Cooperative
Missoula Electric Cooperative
Ravalli Electric Cooperative
Vigilante Electric Cooperative
Fall River Electric Cooperative
