EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 26-91

EXECUTIVE ORDER ESTABLISHING
THE MONTANA PUBLIC VEHICLE FUELING ADVISORY COUNCIL
(REVISING EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 23-91)

WHEREAS, efficient and cost-effective fueling of public vehicles in Montana is essential for proper and economical service delivery; and

WHEREAS, underground storage tanks are an integral, but costly, component of Montana's public sector fueling system; and

WHEREAS, operation and installation of these tanks is becoming more expensive for cities, counties, school districts, state agencies and the private sector as Environmental Protection Agency regulations come into effect; and

WHEREAS, cost saving, cost avoidance and enhanced environmental protection may be available through the joint utilization of consolidated fueling sites by cities, counties, school districts, special districts and state agencies, as well as the use of alternative fuels such as liquified or compressed natural gas.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, STAN STEPHENS, Governor of the State of Montana, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 2-15-122, MCA, do hereby establish the Montana Public Vehicle Fueling Advisory Council.

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of the Council shall be:

- a) to gather information regarding the vehicle fueling needs and practices of Montana public entities including cities, counties, school districts, special districts and state agencies;
- b) to assess cost savings, convenience and efficiency which may be available by consolidating fueling sites and providing for joint usage of these consolidated fuel dispensing sites;
- c) to assess the reduced risk of environmental damage and liability for leaking tanks through a coordinated effort to consolidate fuel sites and eliminate duplicate sites;
- d) to assess the feasibility, cost-effectiveness and environmental impacts of utilizing liquified or compressed natural gas as a substitute fuel for public vehicles;
- e) to recommend a proper public policy role for the state regarding the loss of fueling sites, particularly in rural Montana, as a result of the increasing operational and capital cost of such facilities; and

f) to report its findings and recommendations in a manner which will allow those recommendations to be considered by the Governor for possible inclusion in his budget to be submitted to the 1993 Legislature.

Advisory Council members shall not be eligible for compensation or reimbursed for travel expenses.


IV. EFFECTIVE DATE AND DURATION
