EXECUTIVE ORDER CONTINUING THE MONTANA LEWIS & CLARK
TRAIL ADVISORY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Lewis & Clark Trail has great historical significance to the State of Montana; and

WHEREAS, it is important that Montana consults with other states and organizations concerned with the promotion and preservation of the Lewis & Clark Trail.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, STAN STEPHENS, Governor of the State of Montana, by virtue of the authority vested in me pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of Montana, specifically 2-15-122, MCA, do hereby continue the Lewis & Clark Trail Advisory Council.

I. PURPOSE

The Advisory Council shall recommend to the Governor:

1. Ways to promote public awareness of the historical significance of the Lewis and Clark Expedition and encourage the identification, development and protection of historical sites and outdoor recreational resources along the Lewis and Clark Trail; and
2. Ways the Council can coordinate with other Montana commissions, bureaus, agencies and boards regarding their activities that relate to the history of the Lewis and Clark Trail in order to foster state recognition of the Lewis and Clark Expedition; and
3. Communications and activities with other Lewis and Clark Trail states; the National Lewis and Clark Trail Heritage Foundation, Inc.; The Lewis & Clark Interpretive Center; and federal departments, bureaus and committees concerned with the Lewis and Clark Trail, in order to coordinate and plan activities to foster state and national recognition of the significance of the Lewis and Clark Expedition, including promotion of the aims and recommendations of the Federal Lewis and Clark Trail Commission, which existed from 1964 to 1969.

The Montana Historical Society shall provide staff support to the advisory council.


IV. COMPENSATION

V. DURATION


This Council shall exist for a period of two years from the effective date of this Order unless otherwise ordered by subsequent Executive Order. This order is effective immediately.
