# MINUTES OF THE MEETING LEGISLATIVE ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE MONTANA STATE SENATE

March 7, 1977

The meeting of the Legislative Administration Committee was called to order by Chairman Kolstad on the above date in Room 404 of the State Capitol Building on adjournment.

ROLL CALL. All members were present except Senator Norman. (excused).

Senator Kolstad introduced William Pitts, President, International Roll-Call Corporation to the committee members.

Mr. Pitts suggested that the display boards be put over the exit doors with 30 lines on each side. This would drop the lines from 80 lines to 60 lines. The figures would remain the same size.

Senator McOmber asked if the boards could be seen from any place in the Senate.

Mr. Pitts explained that the boards can be put at an angle so that they can be seen by all members.

Senator Graham asked how fast the numbers could be changed on the board?

Nancy Aagenes explained that the operator will change them. She watched him today and it didn't take long to change them.

Senator Warden does not like the color of the trim on the calendar display board and was wondering if the color could be changed to match the decor of the woodwork.

Mr. Pitts stated that the color could be changed to a bronz or the wood trim could be used.

Senator McOmber said that the leadership has been getting together to discuss the Russell painting and have decided that if we purchase the painting it will have to go at the front of the rostrum.

Mr. Pitts will make drawings and present them to the committee. He stated there is not enough time to change the boards this session, but said they will be ready before the next session. He will work on the roll call board now.

Senator McOmber asked that we have some kind of commitment from the International Roll-Call that this will be completed before next session.

Senator Lee thought that the painting should be put in front and along with the calendar display board.

Senator Graham asked what the price of the Russell painting would be and who would own the painting.

Senator Hazelbaker stated the cost was \$450,000.00. Senator McOmber explained that the State of Montana would own the painting as part of the purchase price would be paid by the Historical Museum.

P.W. Wallestad, a private citizen, asked what kind of security we would have when the Legislature was not in session.

Senator McOmber stated that there is insurance on the painting and the cost of the insurance is \$1,000.00 per year. The painting would be in the Historical Museum when we are not in session. He also asked that this information not be given to the press because it is not final.

MOTION: Senator Hazelbaker made a motion to redesign the board so all members can see it.

DISCUSSION: It was decided by members of the committee to get a commitment from Mr. Pitts as to when the work would be completed.

Senator Hazelbaker withdrew his motion.

Mr. Pitts told the committee that the rate for rental and maintenance is the same. (\$8,500.00). This rate is the same for all states.

Senator Kolstad asked when they can expect the alternative drawings to be completed

Nancy Aagenes asked Mr. Pitts to give us something in writing as to what to expect.

Mr. Pitts explained that he would have two alternative drawings for the committee to look at in two weeks.

Senator McOmber asked Mr. Pitts if he had been paid yet.

Mr. Pitts replied no.

Nancy Aagenes explained that the price of the calendar display board is good. The price is \$4,975.00. This would be for two large boards. She also pointed out that a new contract would have to be written to include the new equipment. (Copy of letter sent attached).

Senator Kolstad stated that a cabinet had been built to separate the bills for Senators and asked for comments on this.

Senator McOmber explained that Senator Blaylock had discussed a bill rack with him briefly. Senator Lowe had the plans drawn. I have asked them to work their figures over. It is \$400.00 or so.

Senator Graham asked the advantage of the bill sorter.

Nancy Aagenes explained that there would only be one neat set of bills on their desks instead of having the pages putting one at a time on your desk.

A motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.

RE: Voting Machine and Calendar Display Board







Dear Mr. Pitts:

I am writing this letter so you may clearly understand the expectations of the Senate Legislative Administration Committee in regard to redesigning the calendar display board. By Tuesday, March 22, we should have two alternative drawings of the proposed equipment:

- 1. With the calendar display board above the exit doors in the front corners of the rostrum; and
- 2. With the calendar display board at either side of the roll call board, placed in the open space above the President's desk.

(The outside dimensions of the painting "When the Land Belonged to God" are 7'2" x 4'8".)

We will need confirmation from you that either of these plans can be executed at the originally agreed upon price of \$4,975. It is also my understanding that a visual display of the calendar board for the keyboard operator will be attached to the keyboard. I would like confirmation from you that this equipment will also be included in that price.

The Committee understands that we will not have this equipment before the end of this session. The expectation is that all equipment from International Roll-Call will be installed and operational by the first day of the 1979 legislative session. When a final agreement is reached with your corporation, I expect that the contract will contain a penalty clause relative to each legislative day that the equipment is late.

It is further our understanding that the maintenance and up-dating of the calendar display board will be executed under our original contract with International Roll-Call dated the 4th of February, 1973, at the same price quoted therein (\$8,500 annually). This contract will have to be re-written to include the new equipment.
