# MINUTES OF THE MEETING SENATE STATE ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE MARCH 14, 1877

The meeting was called to order by Senator Towe, Chairman, at 11:00 a.m. in Room 410 of the Capitol Building. The following committee members were present: Senators Towe, Brown, Story, Rasmussen, Roskie, Jergeson, and Blaylock. Senator Devine was excused.

The following bills were discussed: HB 230

HB 493 HB 506 HJR 36 HB 263 HB 182

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 36

Representative Conroy, District 58, sponsor of the bill, stated the purpose of the bill is to increase the membership of Indians on the Boards and in the agencies which affect Indian people.

#### PROPONENTS

Michael Pichette, Executive Secretary of the Democratic Party, stated the intent of the bill is a platform position of the Democratic Party and encourged support of the bill.

There were no further proponents and no opponents to the bill and the hearing was closed.

Senator Jergeson moved House Joint Resolution 36 Be Concurred In. THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

#### HOUSE BILL 493

Representative Harper, District 30, sponsor of the bill, stated the purpose of the bill is to reflect administrative changes in the state historic preservation program and substituting Montana Historical Society for Fish and Game Department where it appears in the bill. It further adds "architectural: to the definition of site and object. He stated the changes made were with the concurrence of all people concerned with the provisions of the bill.

There were no proponents and no opponents to the bill and the hearing was closed.

#### HOUSE BILL 506

Representative Harrington, District 88, sponsor of the bill, stated the bill gives the citizen the opportunity to state on his voter registration his party preference. He emphsized the opportunity to do so is completely voluntary.

#### PROPONENTS

Michael Pichette, Executive Secretary of the Democratic Party, stated the bill gives an opportunity for people to affiliate with a political party without making a donation or filing and being elected. He encouraged support of the bill.

There being no further proponents and no opponents to the bill the hearing was closed.

#### HOUSE BILL 230

Representative Gerke, District 62, sponsor of the bill, asked Bill Groff to present the bill in his absence.

Mr. Groff, Chairman of the Board of Housing, stated the bill simply transfers the Board of Housing from the Department of Community Affairs to the Department of Administration. He stated from an accounting standpoint it would be a smart move.

#### PROPONENTS

Kent Mollohon, Department of Community Affairs, ueged support of the bill as the accounting and mortgage portfolio are in the Department of Administration at present and the Board should also be.

Jack Crosser, Director of the Department of Administration, supported the bill.

Lyle Olson, Financial Officer and Treasurer of the Board of Housing, stated they are using the financial systems of the Department of Administration and strongly supported the bill.

There being no further proponents and no opponents, the hearing was closed.

Senator Roskie moved House Bill 230 Be Concurred In. THE MOTION CARRIED WITH SENATORS JERGESON AND DEVINE ABSENT.

#### House Bill 263

Glen Drake, League of Cities and Towns, was allowed to present his testimony on the bill as the sponsor of the bill had to be out of town and the bill was rescheduled from today to another date. He stated his support of the bill as long as the 10 year provision is retained.

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 36

Senator Blaylock moved to reconsider action on House Joint Resolution 36. THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY WITH SENATORS JERGESON AND DEVINE ABSENT.

Senator Brown moved to amend House Joint Resolution as per the attached

committee report. THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY WITH SENATORS JERGESON AND DEVINE ABSENT.

Senator Blaylock moved House Joint Resolution 36 Be Concurred In As Amended. THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY WITH SENATORS JERGESON AND BLAYLOCK ABSENT.

HOUSE BILL 182

The hearing was reopened to let Tom Schneider, Montana Public Employees Association, present his testimony on the bill. He stated the sponsor submitted a figure change in the bill which was overlooked by the Legislative Council and they would like to make that change at this point. The changes would be on page 1, line 24, page 2, lines 4 and 5, and page 2, lines 12 and 13.

Senator Blaylock moved the amendment #2 on the attached committee report. THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY WITH SENATORS JERGESON AND DEVINE ABSENT.

Senator Roskie moved the amendments #1 and #3 on the attached committee report. THE MOTION CARRIED WITH SENATORS JERGESON AND DEVINE ABSENT.

Senator Rasmussen moved House Bill 182 Be Concurred In As Amended.
THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY WITH SENATORS JERGESON AND DEVINE ABSENT.
