MINUTES OF THE MEETING EDUCATION COMMITTEE MONTANA STATE SENATE

March 24, 1977

The thirtieth meeting of the Senate Education Committee was called to order by Senator Chet Blaylock, Chairman, on the above date, in Room 402 of the State Capitol Building at 11:00 o'clock A. M.

ROLL CALL: All members of the Committee were present, with the exception of Senator Ed Smith who was excused.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL No. 653: An act to allow 16 hours per year of school time to be used for staff training and development actitivies.

Representative Estenson, Helena, District 32, sponsor of the Bill, was called on to present her testimony. She explained the purpose of the Bill was designed to increase skills and knowledge of the teachers and administrators to perform with maximum efficiency by allowing in-service training and programs during school hours. That Pupil Instruction Days are taken up by other school-related functions and this should be considered as important as some of those, and take only an hour or two out of the day.

Proponents of the Bill included:

Louis O. Strand, Helena School District #1, advised the Committee of the problems he has run into as director in corrilating grades K through 12 for staff development, improvement and training; that substitute teachers would not have to be hired at an additional cost to the school if staff time were allowed during the day; and that after-hours sessions are difficult to arrange and attendance is questionable due to other commitments by the teachers.

Brad Morris, Principal, Helena Schools, stated so many new programs are being developed that teachers must be aware of; their time is limited and in-training sessions should be scheduled during the school day. Copy of this written statement is attached.

Alve Thomas, Deputy State Superintendent, thought it would improve the quality of teacher instruction and allow for presentation of programs by outside sources.

No opponents appeared to testify against the Bill.

In closing, Representative Estenson stated she had talked to many of the 175 teachers in her district, all of whom were primarily

concerned with improvement opportunities for their profession.

When questioned by the Committee, Rep. Estenson responded that the 16 hours would be extended over the school year, and Mr. Strand added that was for the entire school, not each individual teacher. Expense factors involving pupil related days versus days at end of term were discussed, along with the difficulty of getting an entire school staff together other than during school periods to participate in training sessions.

There being no further questions, the Chair closed the hearing on House Bill 653.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL No. 596: An act to restore the spending authority of a school district upon the deposit of a refund or rebate.

Representative Shelden, District #22, sponsor of the Bill, could not be present, but nominated Bob Stockton, OSPI, to present the Bill on behalf of the school business administrators. Senator Blaylock asked if this was a private bill, and Mr. Stockton replied affirmatively.

Mr. Stockton explained the problems of school districts receiving refunds unexpectedly from various sources such as insurance companies, over-payment of invoices, cancellation of supply orders, which do not involve any large sums of money, but that for which the budget was considered depleted.

There were no further proponents to the Bill, nor were there any opponents.

After short discussion, Senator Bill Mathers moved that House Bill No. 596 BE CONCURRED IN; motion was seconded and carried by unanimous vote. Senator Blaylock will carry the Bill on the floor.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL NO. 620: An act to coordinate the requirements for public hearings contained in the taxpayers information act and the school budget system.

Representative Eudaily, House District #100, sponsor of the Bill, was called on to present his testimony. He explained the problem schools face in complying with the laws of the taxpayers act and those governing school budgets as to the 4 different hearing dates they must advertise when trying to complete the district's budget. Notice of public hearings must be advertised each time which means duplication of efforts unnecessarily and added costs.

Proponents of the Bill included:

Chad Smith, Mont. School Boards Association, who reiterated that the duplication of efforts and confusion of the present system was being asked to be clarified.

There was no opposition to the Bill.

After short discussion, Senator Bill Mathers moved that House Bill No. 620 BE CONCURRED IN, motion was seconded and carried by unanimous vote. Senator Mathers will carry the Bill on the floor.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL No. 351: Discussion centered on non-certified persons coaching sports as being competent, under supervision of the athletic director and the advisability of using lay persons.

Senator Margaret Warden moved that House Bill No. 351 BE CONCURRED IN; motion was seconded and carried by unanimous vote. Senator Jack Healy will carry the Bill on the floor.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL No. 448: After short discussion, Senator Bill Mathers moved that House Bill 448 BE NOT CONCURRED IN; motion was seconded and carried by majority vote, with Senator Ed Smith voting "no".

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL No. 239; Staff attorney Bobinski explained the proposed amendments to the Committee. Discussion held pertained to rate of unemployment comp.

Senator Margaret Warden moved that the proposed amendments of March 22nd BE ADOPTED; motion was seconded and carried unanimously.

Senator Mathers moved that House Bill 239 AS AMENDED BE CONCURRED IN; motion was seconded and carried by majority, with Senators Blaylock and Smith voting "no". Senator Fasbender will carry the Bill on the floor.

ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 12:10 P.M.
