MINUTES OF THE MEETING
BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY COMMITTEE
MONTANA STATE SENATE

The meeting of the Business and Industry Committee was called to order by Chairman Frank Hazelbaker on the above date in Room 404 of the State Capitol Building.

ROLL CALL: All members were present.

CONSIDERATION AND DISPOSITION OF HJR 90.

Representative J. Melvin Williams, District 70, stated he was chief sponsor of this bill. This bill is similar to the bill SR 4 of which Senator Bill Lowe is the sponsor.

Representative Williams stated HJR 90 is a joint resolution of the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Montana requesting the Legislature and executive department of the State of Washington to encourage and permit the construction of appropriate port facilities for unloading crude oil for shipment by pipeline to the northern states, including the State of Montana.

He stated as most of you know through publicity and through newspapers, hopefully by July this year, the crude will start flowing through the Alaskan pipeline. By the end of 1977 they hope to have 1,200,000 barrels per day through the pipeline. In 2-3 years, one million and one-half barrels will be flowing. At the present time the mideast oil can unload at the many ports that we have and they get to the refineries that are close to the port. They have many proposals for pipelines.

He read a few lines from the Wellhead. The article was written by Don Allen. In closing he stated he believes this is a most important resolution and could be important to the oil industries in Montana. He urged approval of this resolution.

Senator Regan made a motion that HJR 90 Be Concurred In. Senator Kolstad seconded. All were in favor. Senator Lowe will carry on the floor.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON HOUSE BILL 304.

Senator Peterson stated he had an amendment. This would be to strike Section 7 in its entirety.

Senator Kolstad seconded this amendment. All were in favor.

Senator Lowe then stated he had an amendment. This is to strike Section 8 in its entirety. Senator Kolstad seconded. Roll call vote. 6-2. Section 8 is deleted.

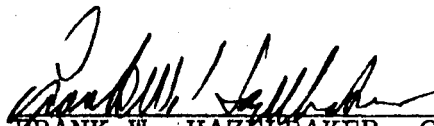
Senator Goodover stated he had some amendments. The first one was to insert on page 3, section 2, line 1, following "retailer" the words "and is not a maximum markup" and on page 3, section 2, line 15, following "wholesaler" the words "and is not a maximum markup." Senator Goodover moved that these be adopted.

Senator Devine seconded. All were in favor except for Senator Regan.

Senator Goodover then moved that we adopt the amendments submitted by Russ Livergood of the Montana Retail Association. Senator Kolstad seconded. Roll call vote. 3 yes and 5 no.

Senator Regan then made a motion that HB 304 As Amended, Be Concurred In. Senator Peterson seconded. Roll call vote. 5 yes and 3 no.

ADJOURN: There being no further business, Chairman Hazelbaker adjourned the meeting at 12:00 noon.

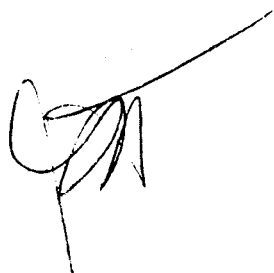
