HOUSE BILL 808

Representative Driscoll, District 91, state the bill is the companion legislation to HJR 34. It provides for striking the automatic repealer on gubernatorial campaign fund and changes the name to the Public Campaign Fund Act. He further stated that by making the gubernatorial campaign fund permanent, the monies will accumulate into a large enough pool to hopefully finance the campaign in four years.

OPENING STATEMENT TO THE CONFIRMATION HEARING OF THE SENATE STATE ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE, MONDAY, APRIL 11, 1977, OF MR. JOE KLABUNDE, CHAIRMAN, MONTANA FISH AND GAME COMMISSION

Mr. Chairman, Members of the Committee:

Over eight years, three Governors from both political parties have given me the honor of serving you in the Montana Fish and Game Commission.

During that time, I have worked with ranchers and sports clubs all over the state to improve landowner relations. As you know, a very small percentage of sportsmen cause problems for everyone else.

Justifiably, farmers and ranchers who have to take time to pick up after fishermen and hunters are reluctant to open their land.

Even before I was first appointed to the Fish and Game Commission by Governor Tim Babcock, when I didn't even know the present Governor, I went out and talked with landowners to discuss these problems. I was successful, as I have been as a fish and Game Commissioner, in opening land and reservoirs that had been closed. By providing signs, garbage cans and even newspaper ads—some of them at my own expense—I've encouraged sportsmen to be considerate of landowners. I have done this kind of work because I think it's necessary to the future of hunting and fishing. I like to hunt and fish; I've done my share and I've enjoyed every minute of it. I've raised my kids to be good sportsmen and appreciate our fish and wildlife, and I've urged them to do the same with their kids.

As I view it, this is the most important function of the Fish and Game Commission—to guarantee that we have something left in the future of what most of us take for granted today—Montana's fish and wildlife. We have to continually work for better relations with

landowners, because after all, two/thirds of the state is private land and to hunt or fish on these lands is a privilege, and not a right.

During my years as a commissioner, I've listened to sportsmen, landowners, outfitters, and the public, not only in my own district, but from throughout the state. I've attempted to work out solutions to mutual problems, and to see that the public has a voice in Fish and Game decision-making and policy. The Commission's role is to insure that the public is heard and responded to.

The Fish and Game Commission and Department has a big job to do-not just for sportsmen, but for the general public as well through our Recreation and Parks program. This job must be done efficiently and with involvement by the public if we are to do an acceptable job. This is the Commission's role—to insure that the public has a voice, and I'm firmly dedicated to preserving that role.

I am grateful to Governors Judge, Anderson, and Babcock for giving me the opportunity to serve the public in the area which is of greatest interest to me. I have always enjoyed performing what I consider my responsibility as a citizen to help elect to public office those I consider best qualified. As everyone who ever runs for office knows only too well, fund-raising is an essential and respectable part of that process. It is the area of campaign work which I think I am particularly good at. I make apologies to no one for my involvement in the political system. If we Americans do not choose and work for the candidates of our choice, then someone else will choose them for us.
