

JUDICIARY COMMITTEE

The first meeting of the House Judiciary Committee was called to order by Representative John Scully, at 8:15 a.m. in Room 436 of the Capitol Building. All members were present.

Chairman Scully asked each member to introduce his or her self. He introduced Larry Weinberg the attorney assigned to this committee from the Legislative Council and Mary Ellen Connelly, secretary to the committee.


