HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE PROCEEDINGS:

A Human Services Committee meeting was held on January 26, 1979 in the Capitol Annex room #20. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Polly Holmes at 1:30 and all members were present.

HOUSE BILL #206--SPONSOR: Rep. Steve Waldron, District #97, introduced his bill to eliminate the medical-related qualifications for the Director of the Department of Health and Environmental Sciences and to provide for a Deputy Director who must be a physician. The reason behind this bill is that in the past, there have been problems because the Director of this department has had no experience or knowledge of administrative duties. PROPONENTS: Dr. Jack McMahon, Medical Association, said that the purpose is to allow the appointment of this Director who doesn't necessarily have to be a doctor. A doctor is trained to do just that, not to be an administrator. An exception has been with Dr. Knight, but in the past there have been a lot of problems because of the lack of expertise in running such a department. This bill also provides for a deputy director who must be a doctor who could advise the administrator on medical-related problems. OPPONENTS: Mr. David Lackman, Montana Health Association, feels that although the department Director should be a competent administrator, it is more important that he have a medical background. Increasing responsibilities for supervision of medical services for state departments of health are on the way and non-medical personnel in the Department require supervision by a person licensed to practice medicine in Montana. This is a legal requirement and cannot be assumed by a deputy director. Details of administration can be handled by an administrative assistant under policies formulated by the Director and the Board. A do not pass is recommended. Mr. Jerome T. Leonard, Montana Medical Association, said that he had been lobbying since 1971 for this and other medical related organizations and feels that a medical degree is necessary because of the technical sub-systems and that a layman wouldn't know how to handle the reports, etc. Out of 50 states, only six do not have doctors as the heads of their Health Departments. I urge you to give this a do not pass. Don Pratt, Optometric Association, said that he concurred with others and that he had previously worked with the Health Department. He felt that without having a physician as the Director of this Department that many of the functions could not have been implemented. Also, passage of this bill would entail many changes in current rules. I urge a do not pass on this bill.

SENATE BILL #45--SPONSOR: Senator Himsel, District 9, introduced his bill with his apologies for taking up the committee's time to correct changes in laws relating to professional and occupational licensing; but they do deserve our scrutiny. These changes are not substantive, but rather primarily punctuation, spelling, grammar or typographical changes. PROPONENTS: Mr. Bob Pyfer, representing the Code Commissioner, claimed to be available for any questions and that his office request that the committee give a do pass recommendation.

The following action was taken:

Senate Bill #45 was given a do pass recommendation to the Consent Calendar by Rep. O'Connell. The motion was passed unanimously.

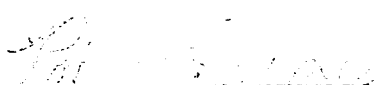
House Bill #206 was given a do not pass recommendation by Rep. Fabrega. The motion was carried with an 18 to one vote in it's favor.

House Bill #34 was given a do pass as amended by Rep. Frates. The motion was passed unanimously.


House Bill #112 was given a do pass as amended by Rep. Gould. The motion was pass unanimously.

House Bill #201 was given a do not pass recommendation by Rep. Keyser. A substitute motion was made by Rep. Azzara to table the bill for further action. This motion was not carried with a 15 to 4 vote. A do no pass recommendation was made by Rep. Stobie which carried with a 15 to 4 vote also.

The committee meeting was adjourned at 3:30 by Chairman Holmes.
