

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
JUDICIARY COMMITTEE
EXECUTIVE SESSION
February 7, 1979

The meeting was called to order following the regular meeting of the House Judiciary Committee in room 436 of the Capitol Building. Chairman John Scully presided. All members were present with the exception of Representative Eudaily, still in the hospital.

9:50 a.m. Mr. Scully read a judgment for Geraldine C. Strong versus the State of Montana and the Department of Institutions. He explained the procedure and that the committee could enter a committee bill to pay the judgment. Representative Lory moved to do this and the motion carried with the vote unanimous.

Mr. Scully read a letter to Senator Pat Goodover about corporations and that the signature of directors must be notarized. Representative Seifert moved that the committee draft a bill to this effect and the motion carried with the vote unanimous.

Representative Scully explained problems with the Subdivision Platting Act and discussed ways that it could be remedied. There was general discussion about subdivisions and HB 46 which deals with subdivisions. Mr. Scully has prepared amendments and asked if the committee wished to submit a committee bill to remedy some of the problems. Representative Lory moved that the committee draft a committee bill and the motion carried with Representatives Holmes and Kemmis voting "no".

Mr. Scully directed the secretary to send a letter to the Legislative Counsel stating that this be done, to be included also is the committee bill on notice for libel, already ordered by the committee.
