

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
JUDICIARY COMMITTEE
March 30, 1979

A special meeting of the Judiciary Committee was called to order by Chairman Scully at 1:15 p.m. in room 436 of the Capitol Building on Friday, March 30. Members present were: Representatives Anderson, Daily, Eudaily, Holmes, Iverson, Keedy, Kemmis, Keyser, Lory, Pavlovich, Uhde, and Teague. All others were absent.

Mr. Scully stated that he had talked with Senator Towe about his two bills that were tabled in the committee. It was decided that the committee would consider action on Senate Bill No. 345.

There was discussion about what the problem was with the bill, what it would do and how it fit with Representative Keedy's bill.

There was discussion about the dispositional hearing situation. The comment was made that you have to have some clarity in the disposition.

Mr. Scully said, speaking to Mr. Keedy, I don't know what is in your bill but Senator Towe came to me and said that there was no mechanism to deal with disposition. Is there another bill that could be involved.


Mr. Keedy said it could be incorporated in the other bill if the committee so desired but that this bill would have to be amended to make it work. Mr. Scully reminded the committee that the deadline for amendments had passed and that nothing could be done with this bill except pass it as is and that if someone wanted to move, to go ahead and do so.

No one wanted to move to bring out the bill so it was left tabled.
