

MINUTES OF MEETING
SENATE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE
January 9, 1979

The fourth meeting of the Senate Judiciary Committee was called to order by Senator Everett R. Lensink on the above date in room 331 at 10:02 a.m.

CONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILL 37:

The first bill to be brought to the attention of this committee was Senate Bill 37, which is an act to generally revise and clarify the laws relating to evidence. Joan Mayer from the Legislative Council, went through this bill section by section. She gave a copy of the rules of evidence to each two senators. She stated that they are trying to reconcile what the legislature says with what the Supreme Court rules.

Senator Brown moved that the bill be amended on page 8, line 5 by striking the word, "burden" and inserting the words, "standard of proof". The motion passed unanimously.

Senator Van Valkenburg moved that the bill be amended on line 11, page 8 by deleting the words, whenever the evidence is contradictory, ". This motion passed unanimously.

Joan Mayer continued through the bill section by section until 11:36 a. m., at which time the meeting was adjourned.
