#### MINUTES OF THE MEETING STATE ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE MONTANA STATE SENATE

February 17, 1979

The twenty-seventh meeting of the State Administration Committee was called to order by Chairman Pete Story on the above date in Room 442 of the State Capitol at 8:00 a.m.

ROLL CALL: All members of the Committee were present.

The Chairman declared this was an executive session to consider all the various board bills and the options available. He stated there were seven options: 1) go with the "super board" concept; 2) maintain the status quo by recreating these boards; 3) if SB 406 were enacted, it did not reestablish these boards, so something in addition would have to be done; 4) enact SB 443; 5) enact SB 443 and SB 460; 6) almost the same as 5; and 7) a combination of all of these. These options were prepared in chart form which was handed out to all members, with a copy being attached to these minutes.

Sen. Jergeson commented that he would like to go with the "super board" concept, but agreed it might have some problems. He felt the boards should be attached to their logical department, but there might be some merit in the licensing and inspection functions being together, so perhaps some of them should be moved to the Department of Administration. The accountants and professional groups could be put under the Department of Business Regulation for the same reason the state banking board fits under that department. Because we don't know what will happen ultimately, and in order to try not to inadvertently overlook or fail to reestablish some of these boards which would then terminate them, these DPOL functions could be moved also.

Sen. Story explained his reasoning on passing some of these to the House and their possible treatment there and not wanting to leave some of them adrift if the proper bills weren't passed.

Answering Sen. Hafferman's question on the real estate board, Sen. Jergeson stated a review by the Legislative Auditor showed that board was not operating properly, and so he felt moving them to the most logical place to manage its functions makes sense. Likewise with the rest of the boards - there should be some coordination, and transferring from the DPOL shouldn't be any problem because they were only attached there for administrative purposes; it did not have any control over any of these boards.

Sen. Story mentioned going back to before reorganization when there were so many boards no one had any actual authority to do anything. So, they were created under state offices so that the state would have authority over them; some mention has been made as to restraint of trade by this structure of trade boards over professions, but that by developing the DPOL, these boards were self-supporting and yet had some executive over all. He warned

against inadvertently creating a monopolistic type of situation or a closed shop and felt that the inspection function was the bone of contention for some of the trades and cited as an example a building code bill which was passed for the benefit of the contractors, not the public. If these boards were put under these large departments, the nature of their functions might change and he was not sure Montanans wanted a department head making decisions over a particular vocation that pertains to a man's existence. He felt the best course was to try to maintain a sort of peace treaty, if possible.

Sen. Jergeson stated if this Committee tries to maintain the status quo, then it should recommend to the entire Legislature that the "sunset" law be repealed.

Sen. Rasmussen expressed concern that the process was a waste of time or that some boards should not be sunsetted; he felt the law was of some value and by reestablishment of the necessary boards a good purpose was accomplished.

RECONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILL NO. 247: Sen. Rasmussen moved that Senate Bill No. 247 DO NOT PASS. Discussion was called for.

Sen. Ryan questioned what would happen if the Committee did this bill and nothing else. Sen. Story replied that the results would be elimination of all the boards reviewed under "sunset" this time.

Sen. Jergeson commented on the lack of response from the general public on these matters as an assumption of their willingness to let the legislators make the decisions; the only people heard from were those in the particular occupation or trade.

Sen. Brown asked Sen. Jergeson for an explanation of the reasoning behind SB 247. He responded that the Audit Committee, in reviewing the 14 boards, met with the staff people of the various boards to determine their functions; then members of the professions were allowed their turn. On the question of a public board handling the function of licensing and inspection, we came up with the suggestion of an over-all board to do these functions, using the insurance bureau as an example that seemed to be working well.

Sen. Roskie commented on the period when there were no boards to regulate which resulted in the "let the buyer beware" attitude, and the development of a board covering the real estate profession and the restraint of trade problems. He felt the public was the loser and favored public members on these boards.

Sen. Jergeson cited the Outfitters & Guides Association which came to the legislature requesting certain regulations and that they were then attached to the Fish and Game as their philosophies were more closely related to that department. He also felt the professions would still have a great deal of control over the profession under the three major boards provided in SB 247.

Upon roll call vote, the motion carried by majority, with Sen. Jergeson voting "no".

RECONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILL NO. 443: There was considerable discussion on the question of the next bill to consider, particularly concerning Senate Bill 443. Thereupon, Sen. Rasmussen moved that Senate Bill No. 443 DO NOT PASS. Further discussion centered on what would happen if this bill were killed now, with Sen. Jergeson making a plea for the options allowed by the bill, including amendments.

Upon roll call vote on SB 443, the motion failed, with Senators Roskie, Brown, Ryan and Jergeson voting "no". Action on this bill was then deferred for a later time.

RECONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILL NO. 489: Sen. Story announced a set of amendments had been submitted which constituted a peace treaty between the CPA's and the LPA's, and called on Larry Huss and Neil Lynch to present explanations from those two factions. Each presented his case in going through the amendments offered and that they were essentially in agreement and that the 6-year review clause had been deleted.

After discussion, Sen. Roskie moved that Senate Bill 489 be amended as proposed, to which Sen. Jergeson made a substitute motion that each amendment be considered for adoption separately. Motion failed.

Upon further discussion, Sen. Roskie withdrew his motion. Chairman Story declared the amendments would be considered separately and called on Larry Huss to go through them and explain each fully.

After explanation by Mr. Huss, Sen. Roskie moved the adoption of Amendment #1 on Sheet I; motion prevailed with unanimous approval.

Sen. Jergeson interjected that before the Committee considered amending bills pertaining to establishing boards, it should first consider the bills terminating these boards so time would not be wasted in amending a bill on a board to be terminated, such as SB 391 pertaining to the public accountants' board. Sen. Roskie agreed. After further discussion, Sen. Jergeson moved the adoption of the remaining amendments on Sheet I, which motion unanimously carried.

Sen. Rasmussen moved the adoption of the amendments on Sheet II.

Sen. Jergeson stated he didn't have any problem with the peace treaty between the CPA's and the LPA's, but the make-up of the board should be: 2 CPA's, 1 LPA and 2 public members as the proposed three CPA members gave them a clear majority and so moved.

Sen. Rasmussen felt the board should reflect the numbers involved in the profession as there was about a 7 to 1 ratio of one group and a distortion of the ratio would result by this change. Sen. Jergeson felt the public members of a board were the mediators between factions. Sen. Rasmussen questioned if there was a problem with the board constituted as it had been previously. Sen. Jergeson replied the Audit Committee was very impressed with the cooperation of this board, but didn't want complete domination by one profession.

To Sen. Brown's inquiry, Mr. Lynch replied they had made a deal and must adhere to it, which was Mr. Huss' reply also.

Sen. Roskie commented on the philosophical problems with peer boards and the effectiveness of any public members on such boards and questioned that the public really felt a desire to be a member of these boards.

Upon voting on the motion to change the board members by Sen. Jergeson, the motion failed, with Senators Story, Roskie, Rasmussen and Ryan voting "no".

Upon the motion of Sen. Rasmussen to adopt the amendments on Sheet II, with Sen. Hafferman absent at this time, voting was unanimously in favor.

The Chairman recessed the meeting at 9:30 a.m. to allow members' attendance at other meetings.

The meeting was reconvened at 10:00 a.m. by Chairman Story, with SB 489 still under consideration.

Sen. Jergeson moved that the board of public accountants under SB 489 be attached to the Department of Business Regulation as he felt that was the proper agency to regulate this board. Sen. Rasmussen spoke against this motion.

Upon roll call vote, the motion failed with only Senators Roskie and Jergeson voting "yes".

Sen. Rasmussen then moved that SB 489 DO PASS AS AMENDED; motion passed without opposition. Amendments are as they appear on the Standing Committee Report attached.

RECONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILLS 486 AND 387: Pertaining to the Warm Air Heating & Ventilation boards.

Sen. Brown moved that Senate Bill No. 486 DO NOT PASS; motion carried without opposition.

After short discussion, Sen. Rasmussen moved that Senate Bill No. 387 DO NOT PASS; upon roll call vote, motion carried by majority, with Sen. Jergeson voting "no".

RECONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILLS 411 AND 498: Pertaining to the architects.

Sen. Roskie, as sponsor of the bill, advised it had some changes from the way the previous board was constituted to allow for a public member on the board and some additional requirements.

Sonny Hanson, representing the profession, advised this basically follows the Audit Committee's recommendations except for the "super board" concept and the provision for competitive bidding as in their profession, they do not have competitive bidding.

Sen. Roskie moved that Senate Bill No. 498 DO PASS.

Responding to Sen. Hafferman's inquiry regarding competitive bidding, Mr. Hanson explained that the practice in the trade is to go through a selection process for an architect and then negotiate a fee contract.

Sen. Story cautioned that in considering these different groups, language changes in the bills recreating these boards could change the boards considerably from their pre-existing form.

Sen. Jergeson felt that if the Committee went with SB 498, a new section should be added dealing with competitive bidding.

The Chairman reminded the Committee that there was very little time in which to consider all the bills remaining and some of this amending could be done in the House.

Sen. Roskie read the section in SB 411 which referred to competitive bidding, commenting that these contracts are universally negotiated and that the practice was standard. Sen. Rasmussen stated that this question should be addressed by a full hearing and that this Committee presently is without the information necessary to deal with the matter.

Sen. Jergeson moved that Senate Bill No. 411 DO PASS, to which Sen. Roskie made a substitute motion that Senate Bill No. 411 DO NOT PASS. This substitute motion carried by majority vote, with Sen. Jergeson voting "no". Reverting to the original motion of Sen. Roskie for a DO PASS on Senate Bill No. 498, upon roll call vote, the motion carried by a majority vote, with Sen. Jergeson voting "no".

RECONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILL NO. 391: Sen. Brown moved that this bill DO NOT PASS; motion carried by majority vote, with Sen. Jergeson voting "no".

RECONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILL NO. 457: Sen. Brown moved that Senate Bill No. 457 DO NOT PASS, and stated his reasons as this particular electricians' board in protecting its trade was abusing the public and not policing its own trade. In trying to protect

the public and assure that these people are competent, we could perhaps load the board with public members, but he did not feel the board was functioning properly now.

Discussion pertained to the question if this board should have under its control both the licensing and inspection functions.

Sen. Hafferman made a substitute motion that SB 457 DO PASS.

Discussion pertained to the main consideration of the protection of the public health, welfare and safety by this board and if public members would be effective in assuring properly competent people were licensed.

Upon roll call vote the substitute DO PASS motion failed, with Senators Roskie, Brown, Rasmussen and Jergeson voting "no".

RECONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILLS 422 AND 388: Sen. Hafferman moved that Senate Bill No. 442 DO PASS.

Sen. Jergeson reminded the Committee that it was the Engineers & Land Surveyors who asked for the sunset review originally.

Sen. Roskie questioned the increased number on the board as this bill recreates it as it would add two public members; Sen. Rasmussen also questioned if this profession was large enough to justify seven professional members.

Sen. Jergeson moved that Senate Bill 442 be amended on page 6, line 24 to strike "9" and insert "7", and on page 7, line 1, to strike "5" and insert "3", which takes off two engineers.

Sen. Roskie felt the nine-member board should include two land surveyors for better representation.

Discussion centered on the appropriate number of people to adequately represent the various professions and the public on this board.

Sen. Rasmussen made a substitute motion to amend SB 442 to provide that the board consist of four professional engineers, two public members and one land surveyor; this motion failed with only Senators Rasmussen and Hafferman voting "yes".

On Sen. Jergeson's motion to amend to provide three professional engineers, two land surveyors and two public members, this motion also failed, with Senators Story, Roskie, Rasmussen and Ryan voting "no".

Reverting back to Sen. Hafferman's motion for a Do Pass, this carried by majority vote, with Senator Jergeson voting "no".

RECONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILL NO. 388: Sen. Ryan moved that this bill DO NOT PASS; motion carried by majority vote, with Sen. Jergeson voting "no".

RECONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILL NO. 385: Sen. Jergeson moved that Senate Bill No. 385 DO PASS.

Discussion pertained to Sen. Brown's suggestion of putting more public members on the plumbers and electricians' boards.

Sen. Brown made a substitute motion that SB 385 DO NOT PASS. Upon roll call vote, this motion carried by majority, with Sen. Jergeson voting "no".

RECONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILL NO. 458: Discussion pertained to putting more members of the public on the board or passing SB 460.

Sen. Jergeson read the section of the statutes in the MCA dealing with the board of plumbers and its membership.

Sen. Brown moved that his board be increased to allow three more public members, which would increase it to a nine-member board.

Discussion pertained to the adequate protection of the public if the board were eliminated with Sen. Jergeson stating that the Building Code inspectors would probably have jurisdiction.

Sen. Ryan questioned page 6, line 7, increasing the number of people on the boards which would force these boards to raise more money in order to pay for them.

Upon roll call vote, the motion carried by majority, with Senators Story, Roskie and Ryan voting "no".

Sen. Ryan then moved that SB 458 DO PASS AS AMENDED. Sen. Jergeson made a substitute motion to attach the board to the Department of Administration.

During discussion on the inspection function, Sen. Steve Brown advised that the request for more building code inspectors was for six, not 63, and further discussion pertained with the inspection function.

Upon roll call vote, the substitute motion failed, with only Sen. Rasmussen and Jergeson voting "yes".

Reverting back to the motion of Sen. Hafferman on SB 458 for a Do Pass As Amended, motion carried by majority vote, with Sen. Jergeson voting "no".

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 457: Sen. Poskie questioned portions of the bill, particularly Sec. 18, page 19.

Sen. Hafferman again moved the bill DO PASS; upon further discussion, this motion was allowed to be withdrawn in order to work out amendments.

#### SB 390

Sen. Jergeson suggested that SB 390 could be amended to meet the Committee's requirements.

Sen. Story agreed that SB 390 could be amended to delete everything about the superboard and simply reconstitute the board as it previously existed.

Sen. Brown questioned changing the intent of a bill. John Northy of the Audit Committee was asked if these amendments could be prepared to reflect the Committee's intention; he indicated he would work with Sen. Jergeson in preparing the necessary amendments.

Sen. Jergeson moved that SB 390 be amended to reconstitute the electrician's board with three industry members and two public members.

After discussion on the makeup of the electrician's board, the motion on the amendments for SB 390 passed without opposition. Sen. Jergeson will see that the amendments are prepared for the consideration of the Committee by Monday, February 19th. A DO PASS AS AMENDED motion was made by Sen. Jergeson on SB 390; motion carried with Sen. Ryan voting "no".

Sen. Roskie then moved that Senate Bill 457 DO NOT PASS; motion carried by majority vote, with Senators Ryan and Hafferman voting "no".

RECONSIDERATION OF SENATE BILL NO. 460: Sen. Roskie voiced concern that such a large bill, prepared in haste, had many problems, and they did not have adequate time to digest it; that all petty grievances would end up in this proposed three-man board. He also felt the Committee had reviewed the boards and brought them together, and passage of this bill would change their actions, suggesting this proposed board would be like a "supreme court" over all the various boards.

Roger Tippy addressed the Committee, saying both he and Steve Brown had served as hearings officers for some of the boards under consideration. He then cited an example case he had handled for the Board of Medical Examiners which was very technical on a malpractice suit. He felt the type of expertise necessary to properly evaluate such cases would be lacking under Sen. Brown's bill calling for lay people. In addition, they would decide probation, censure, etc. for infractions. The only group adequately covered is the lawyers, while this bill would set a double standard on everyone else. He then quoted from a case in a Wisconsin court pertaining to professional people deciding questions pertinent to that profession He also stated the licensed professions did not have time to digest this bill because of the late introduction and suggested amendments.

Sen. Steve Brown, in defending his bill, stated the basic issue on the appeals function was fairness. The only function of the proposed appeals board would be handling of contested cases - to review the original decision of the licensing board based on only one thing: the rules of the board itself. The present rules applying to all these boards as they now apply would continue. These decisions of the appeal board could still be appealed to the State Supreme Court. It would not have the power to say what should be done, only if revocation of license would be proper under the facts of the case. This would open the door to more public scrutiny of these professions in permitting an independent board to review contested cases. He introduced this as a friend of the profession.

Sen. Roskie felt there wasn't time to adequately go through the amendments to see what they would do and perhaps a motion for a Do Not Pass would be premature, but he could not go with the bill unless they had time to fully consider it.

Sen. Rasmussen suggested going with the appeal board but delete all references to the public members.

Sen. Story commented it pertains to boards which presently did not have public members, to which Sen. Roskie replied he thought SB 460 dealt with all the boards, not just those under the sunset review this time.

Sen. Jergeson made a substitute motion that SB 460 DO PASS and explained his position for wanting additional time to work on the bill in the House.

Sen. Hafferman commented that his reason for coming to Helena was to save money and cut bureaucracy and felt this bill expands it.

Sen. Ryan felt the creation of an appeals board whose decisions could also be appealed was a futile exercise and delay of final decision when a person having a case heard already is subject to much delay and that putting public members on these boards does not get the public involved.

In defense, Sen. Steve Brown stated it does not create a new bureaucracy but merely requires a three-member board so all the people sitting on all these various boards do not have to be called in from outside Helena to make a decision.

Further discussion on the merits of an appeals board or amendments to the bill resulted in a stalemate and the matter was held for further consideration as time had run out.

#### ADJOURNMENT:

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 12:00 noon.

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#### STATEMENT OF INTENT REGARDING SENATE BILL No. 370

A statement of intent is included with this Bill because the Committee wished to clarify the reasons for and conditions under which increased compensation is granted to owners of private aircraft when used for state business.

- (1) The intent of this increase is to permit adequate compensation for the use of private aircraft when used for state business.
- (2) It is also the intent of this Bill that the Department of Administration provide rules to insure the necessary computation and documentation of the savings effected by, or the necessity for, the use of private aircraft rather than the use of state motor vehicles for state business. This cost-efficiency documentation pertains to Section 1, subsection (6) of Senate Bill No. 370.
