

MINUTES OF THE MEETING  
LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE  
MONTANA STATE SENATE

MARCH 17, 1979

The meeting of the Local Government Committee was called to order by Chairman McCallum on March 17, 1979, at 12:30 in Room 108 of the State Capitol Building.

ROLL CALL: All members were present with the exception of Senators Story and Watt who were both excused.

Dennis Taylor, staff researcher, was also present.

Many visitors were in attendance. (See attachment.)

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL 616: Representative Darryl Meyer of District 42, chief sponsor of House Bill 616, gave a brief resume. This bill is an act to require counties to submit purchase and lease agreements to competitive bid.

Don Smith, IFG Leasing Company of Great Falls, stated his support of this bill. He is in favor of legislation which would recognize that counties, cities and school districts can acquire equipment through leasing transactions. Proposals allow long term leases with lower rental payments. Leasing is a good alternative to buying.

Jim Hughes, representing Mountain Bell, stood in support of the bill. Mr. Hughes stated that this bill allows for a tax option.

There were no opponents to the bill. Representative Meyer closed by asking the Committee for a favorable report.

Chairman McCallum opened the meeting to a question and answer period from the Committee. Discussion was held.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL 801: Representative Darryl Meyer of District 42, chief sponsor of HB 801, gave a brief resume. This bill is an act to increase the limit of indebtedness or liability for a county and to clarify the limit on lease obligations of a county. This should have been included but there was a mix-up.

Don Smith, representing IFG Leasing Company of Great Falls, stated his support of the bill. Mr. Smith stated that Great Falls is in favor of this bill. He offered an amendment for page 2, line 1, subsection (b).

Larry Hagbom, representing IFG Leasing Company of Great Falls, stated his support of HB 801. Mr. Hagbom stated this would definitely help counties because of the high cost of equipment. A road grader costs between 80 to 160 thousand. Most counties cannot af-

ford to buy much equipment. This will make it so the commissioners can go to \$100,000.00 without going to the voters. Many counties lease the equipment they need, especially unused years like this with many snow removal problems.

There were no opponents to HB 801.

Representative Meyer made the closing remarks. He stated that this is a much needed bill in view of the past two winters.

The meeting was opened to a question and answer period from the Committee. Discussion was held.

DISCUSSION OF HOUSE BILL 751: Representative Burt Hurwitz of District 45, sponsor of HB 751, gave a brief resume. This bill is an act to permit election or appointment of city judges in third class cities; removing the residence requirement for such office.

Dan Mizner, stood in support of the bill. Mr. Mizner stated that at present j.p.'s cannot serve in the place of city judges if they live outside of the city limits. This bill would correct the problem.

There were no opponents to the bill.

Chairman McCallum then opened the meeting to a question and answer period from the Committee. Discussion was held.

Senator Conover stated this would help his town.

Representative Hurwitz thanked the Committee for their time, and asked that they give this bill their utmost consideration.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL 365: Representative Gerald Kessler of District 66, chief sponsor of HB 365, gave a brief resume. This bill is an act to streamline annexation by petition by eliminating the election in certain circumstances, to extend the proceeding to all municipalities. Representative Kessler stated that this act would streamline annexation processes. In order to annex a petition must be signed by 51% of the resident freeholders of the area to be annexed.

Dan Mizner, of the League of Cities and Towns, stood in support of the bill. He stated that many towns have done this already.

Eva Spaulding, of the League of Women Voters, stood in support of the bill.

Mr. R. E. Ellis, of the Montana Volunteer Fireman's Association, stood in support of the bill.

Art Korn and Dave Fischer, of the Montana State Volunteer

Fire Association, stated their support of the bill.

There were no opponents to the bill. Representative Kessler made the closing remarks. He stated that this bill would allow for orderly growth and that is very necessary.

The meeting was opened to a question and answer period from the Committee. Discussion was held.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL 366: Representative Gerald Kessler of District 66, chief sponsor of HB 366, gave a brief resume. This bill is an act to streamline the various methods of annexation; establishing that each annexation method is separate and distinct. Representative Kessler stated that there are five methods of annexation. This bill makes each of the procedures operate independently of one another. Some statutes are in conflict with one another. This would clear up the procedures.

Mae Nan Ellingson, representing the City of Missoula, stood in support of the bill. She stated that the Planned Community Development Act came about in 1974. Most of the annexed Missoula area is being done by the individual property owner on an individual basis. House Bill 366 would clarify and make each method of annexation separate and would make the rural fire district exclusion only applicable on the one method of annexation.

Dan Mizner, of the League of Cities and Towns, stated his support of the bill. He stated that House Bill 365 and 366 are both needed together.

Eva Spaulding, representing the League of Women Voters, stated her support of HB 366.

Dave Fischer and Art Korn, of the Montana State Volunteer Firemen's Association, both stood in support of the bill.

There were no opponents present.

The meeting was opened to a question and answer period from the Committee. Discussion was held.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 687: This bill is in regard to the county contribution for a veteran's gravestone from \$20 to \$30.

A motion was made by Senator Thomas that House Bill 687 "BE CONCURRED IN". Motion carried unanimously.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 442: This bill is in regard to increasing the maximum salaries of district court reporters.

Senator O'Hara suggested that perhaps this bill could be amended instead of passing it out of Committee in the situation it is in right now.

A motion was made by Senator O'Hara that HB 442 be amended to have a maximum salary of \$18,000. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Senator O'Hara that HB 442 "BE CONCURRED IN, as amended". Motion carried with everyone voting "yes", except Senator Lockrem who voted "no".

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 751: This bill is in regard to permitting election or appointment of city judges in third class cities.

A motion was made by Senator Rasmussen that HB 751 "BE CONCURRED IN". Motion carried.

After some discussion, a motion was made by Senator Rasmussen that the Committee reconsider their actions on HB 751. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Senator Rasmussen that the bill be amended on page 3. Strike lines thirteen through eighteen in their entirety. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Senator Rasmussen that HB 751 "BE CONCURRED IN, as amended". Motion carried.

CONSIDERATION OF HOUSE BILL 808: This bill allows cities other than those of first or second class to elect to terminate P.E.R.S. coverage for their police officers and to join the municipal police officers' retirement system.

Senator Thomas made a motion to accept the proposed amendments which would change the date from January to July throughout the bill. Motion carried.

Mr. Dan Mizner was asked some questions from the Committee. He stated that he did not like to answer without the chief sponsor of the bill present, however, he would answer, but not volunteer information.

Mr. Mizner stated this bill would allow third class cities to come under municipal police system. This will affect only Libby and Whitefish at the present time.

Senator Thomas stated that this will cost the cities money.

A motion was made by Senator Rasmussen that HB 808 "BE NOT CONCURRED IN, as amended". Motion carried with everyone voting "yes" except Senator Peterson who abstained. Motion carried.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 616: This bill requires counties to submit purchase and lease agreements to competitive bid.

Senator Lockrem stated that he did not feel this bill is fair to the taxpayers.

A motion was made by Senator Rasmussen that the amendments proposed by Mountain Bell be accepted. Motion carried with everyone voting "yes" except Senator Lockrem who voted "no".

A motion was made by Senator Lockrem that HB 616 "BE CONCURRED IN, as amended". Motion carried.

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 84: This bill prescribes the duties of Clerk and Recorders and city attorneys with regard to subdivision filing requirements.

A motion was made by Senator Rasmussen that HB 84 "BE CONCURRED IN". Motion carried. (See attachment.)

DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 801: A motion was made by Senator Lockrem that House Bill 801 "BE NOT CONCURRED IN". Motion failed on a tie vote.


DISPOSITION OF HOUSE BILL 616: A motion was made by Senator Rasmussen that the Committee reconsider their actions on HB 616. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Senator Rasmussen to amend HB 616 on page 8, line 23; change the "3" to "7" regarding school bus contract bids.

A substitute motion was made by Senator Lockrem to amend the bill to read three (3) years throughout. Motion carried with all present voting "yes" except Senators Conover and O'Hara.

A motion was made by Senator Lockrem that HB 616 BE CONCURRED IN, as amended". Motion carried.

ADJOURN: With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 2:50. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, March 20th, at 12:00 noon to consider House Bills 81, 851, 682, 244, 125, and 879.
