

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE
January 10, 1981

The House Appropriations Committee met at 8:00 a.m. on January 10, 1981 in Room #104, with Chairman Art Lund presiding and all members were present including Judy Rippingale, Acting Legislative Fiscal Analyst.

HOUSE BILL #114

REPRESENTATIVE JACK MOORE introduced House Bill #114 and asked that the committee take this bill under consideration this morning as there was a deadline involved of 1/23/81. This would allow only thirteen days to go through both houses and be signed by the Governor.

REP. GENE DONALDSON asked to rise to a point of order. He felt this bill should be moved to the House Appropriation's Sub-Committee on Education due to its close relationship to House Bill #94, which has already been under consideration.

REP. JACK MOORE agreed that it should be reviewed by the Education Sub-Committee and indicated that his only concern was getting it through the system before the deadline.

REP. REX MANUEL explained, for the Committee's information, that this should not have been a bill, it should have been a supplement to House Bill #94, and HB #94's appropriation will be reduced by the amount of HB #114.

REP. GENE DONALDSON then moved that this bill be moved to the Sub-Committee on Education and REP. MOORE seconded it. Let the record show that it passed unanimous.

REP. JACK MOORE expressed concern as to when the Sub-Committee would be able to hear it and Rep. Donaldson said it would be scheduled for Monday, the 12th at 8 a.m.

HOUSE BILL #149

CHAIRMAN LUND introduced House Bill #149, an act to increase reimbursement for expenses of members of the legislature from \$40 to \$45 per diem. This originally was part of HB #1 and the Senate indicated that as this was in the statutes it had to be a bill. Chairman Lund asked that a time be set for this bill to be heard. Monday, January 12th at 11:30 a.m. in Room #104 was agreed on. The secretary was instructed to post this notice immediately.

REP. JACK MOORE advised that Representatives Ernst, Conroy and himself would have a conflict with that meeting but would leave their vote with Chairman Lund for that meeting.

CHAIRMAN LUND raised a point regarding bills such as HB #149 which go against his five-bill limit. There will be other similar bills where claims are involved and bills to introduce budget amendments. He did not feel that these should go against his five-bill limit.

REP. BARDANOUE moved that HB #149 be introduced as a committee bill as the money for this bill is within the resolution.

REP. MOORE moved that Rep. Bardanouve's motion be amended to all those bills that are required be considered as committee bills. Rep. Bardanouve seconded the motion. Let the record show that the vote in favor was unanimous.

At 8:15 a.m., CHAIRMAN LUND moved that the Committee go into closed session to discuss an internal matter. It was seconded and the room was cleared.
