


HOUSE RULES COMMITTEE  
47th Legislature  
February 20, 1981

Chairman Fagg convened the Rules Committee at 2:35 p.m., in Room 343. All members were present except Rep. Sivertsen, Rep. Vincent, Rep. Dussault being absent and Rep. Marks arriving late.

The purpose of this meeting was to discuss House Resolution 2. Rep. Eudaily presented the resolution. He felt that some legislators were assigned to more than one interim committee which other representatives who were interested in being members on such committees were not chosen or appointed to any committee. He felt that these people should also have a chance. There was no action taken on the resolution.

House Bill 772 was presented by Rep. Keedy, District 18, Kalispell. He explained that the purpose of the bill would be to back up Rep. Vincent's annual sessions bill in case his bill did not pass this would serve as a substitute bill or in addition to his bill. Joy Bruck also spoke as a proponent to the bill saying that it was a good substitute if Vincent's bill did not pass. There were no opponents. There was a motion by Rep. Marks to DO NOT PASS. Rep Moore called the question and the motion carried unanimously.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned by Rep. Fagg.
