LEGISLATIVE ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

A meeting of the Legislative Administration Committee was called to order by Chairman Bobby Spilker. Members present were, Representative Kanduch, Representative Zabrocki and Representative Spilker. Also in attendance were Speaker Marks, Morris Brusett, Director of Department of Administration, Phil Hauck and John McKittrick of the Architecture and Engineering Division of D. of A., and Senator John Healy. Representatives Meyer and Curtiss, members of the committee, were not present.

The chairman opened the hearing on Senate Joint Resolution No. 21, sponsored by Senator John Healy (District 44). The resolution was submitted at the request of the Capitol Building and Planning Committee and deals with the renovation of the Capitol. (Fact sheet and concept drawings attached). A related bill (HB 478) will approve bonding authority for \$5 million for the \$6 3/4 million project. The bonds will be retired with income from the Capitol Land Grant account.

Representative Kanduch asked that the pictures existing in the Law Library not be destroyed during the renovation, and this was agreed.

Speaker Marks asked what sort of time table was involved in the entire renovation and Mr. Hauck indicated the project should be complete by November, 1984.

Representative Kanduch moved that the resolution be amended to put it back in its original form with the intention of the resolution being referred to a conference committee. It was seconded and passed. Representative Zabrocki moved that SJR 21 be concurred in as amended.

Representative Kanduch moved that the Speaker, majority and minority leaders be authorized to purchase 1000 sheets of legislative stationery and envelopes beyond the 500 originally allocated to them. It was seconded and passed.


whereas, the Capitol Building and Planning Committee found that it is necessary for the Legislature to state its intent with regard to the allocation of space in connection with a remodeling and renovation project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

- (1) That the Legislature endorses the general concept of the preliminary feasibility plan that provides for the following features:
- (a) semi-private office space for legislators in space now occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction, the Legislative Auditor, and committee rooms;
- (b) remodeling of space now occupied by the Supreme Court Justices' chambers and the State Law Library into a Senate Chamber and associated offices:
- (c) saving the historic chamber now occupied by the Supreme Court for a formal hearing room;
- (d) remodeling the space currently occupied by the Senate into eight large committee rooms, four on the third floor and four on the fourth floor;
- (e) renovating the interior of the building to provide service functions required by the above referenced alterations and to provide required life-safety features:
- and (f) renovating the Capitol facade so as to protect the history and tradition that it represents.
- (2) That the second floor of the Capitol remain dedicated to Executive Branch functions.
- (3) That the Legislature assign to the Capitol Building and Planning Committee the responsibility of serving as the owner's representative in working with the architects and planners engaged to do the detailed planning on the above and to make the detailed decisions necessary to accomplish the broad objectives stated in this resolution.
