REP. KEEDY asked how that would be accomplished. REP. MCBRIDE replied that is the purpose of the study that the committee would address. The committee could look at what other states have done in this area. REP. MCBRIDE stressed we need something we can work with. Everyone has conflicts of interest. This needs to be addressed in a workable fashion.

There were no further questions by the committee.

The committee went into EXECUTIVE SESSION.

REP. BROWN moved SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 36 do pass.

The motion carried with REP. SEIFERT opposing.
