Mr. Haubein stated that last years expenditures on the food inventory of \$181,401 left an adequate supply for this year. The supply has been currently checked, and is running at least three months ahead.

SEN. CONROY asked how many patients were at the Center for the Aged.

MR. BLOUKE stated the current capacity is 198.

SEN. THOMAS moved that the supplemental request for \$18,947 for the Center for the Aged be approved.

The motion passed.

There being no further discussion or comments the hearing was adjourned at 9:50.
