It was acknowledged that the extra man short in Great Falls had been funded for but that the budget shortage did not allow the position to be filled. Senator Smith indicated that he felt if people paid their license fees they were entitled to have someone come and check their scales. The total request being \$28,500.00.

REPRESENTATIVE MANUEL made a motion that \$27,500.00 be approved. Motion passed with all in favor.

SENATOR BOYLAN came in late and was excused to go to another meeting.

THE MILWAUKEE RAILROAD request in the Department of Agriculture was then discussed. The Governor's emergency fund (see Exhibit B) was presented and explained that it was set up for natural disasters only. Senator Smith read part of the minutes of the February 2, 1980, Legislative Finance Committee meeting with regard to the Milwaukee Railroad (see Exhibit c). It was confirmed by Bob Robinson that no other presentation was made by either the Governor's office or the Department of Agriculture regarding the Railroad.

REPRESENTATIVE MANUEL made a motion that the \$65,000.00 to the Department of Agriculture be approved. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting "yes" were:

MEETING OF THE LEGISLATIVE FINANCE COMMITTEE

Side 1, Track 3

The meeting of the legislative finance committee reconvened at 8:00 a.m., Saturday, February 2, 1980.

Railroad Proposal (001)

Mr. Dean Hart, federal-state coordinator of the executive office, gave an overview of where the Governor stands concerning alternatives for operation of the Milwaukee railroad and explained action taken over the past week prior to the legislative finance committee meeting.

Mr. Hart stated the Governor's ultimate decision was communicated to the Milwaukee railroad on Friday afternoon. He stated the governor remains strongly supportive of the "new Milwaukee" proposal. However, he has some concern of whether it will ultimately be successful. Also in the press conference on Friday, the Governor indicated that none of the actions taken would in any way encumber the state financially and does not want the state in the railroad business but finds it necessary for the state to take it and then pass it on to a qualified carrier.

Mr. Hart commented on the fall-back positions if the "new Milwaukee" proposal should fail.

Mr. Gordon McComber, director, department of agriculture, Mr. Terry Whiteside, manager of the department's transportation unit and Mr. Ray Brault, attorney for the department were available for specific questions of the committee.

There was discussion of calling a special session. Chairman South expressed his concern and that of the committee members with not having the representation of the entire state unless the legislature collectively could make a decision in regard to the state's liability should the "new Milwaukee" proposal and the fall-back alternatives fail.

Mr. Hart stated he would relay the sentiment of the committee for legislative involvement.

There was continued discussion of the state taking over the railroad line.

University Funding Study (560)

Mr. John Richardson, commissioner of higher education, briefly outlined the procedures to be used by representatives of the university system in testifying on the legislative finance committee staff proposal for university funding.

Commissioner Richardson in his testimony to the committee commented on the progress of the study to date, made observations regarding the formula funding approach in American higher education, commented on the proposed scope for the study and expressed cautionary notes for future developments in the revisions of the methods used to provide financial resources for the university system.
