MINUTES OF TEE MEETINS OF THE JOINT APPROPRIATIO: SUBCOMMITTEE ON EDUCATIO:

February 24, 1981

The Executive Session meeting on the Universities of the Joint Appropriation Subcommittee on Education was called to order at 7 a.m. on Tuesday, February 24, 1981 by Chairman Donaldson in Room l04, Capitol Bldg., Helena, Montana.

All members were present including Bruce Shively and Curt Nichols, Fiscal Analysts.

UNIVERSITIES - FACULTY SALARIES
The first discussion was in regard to faculty salaries at the University.

CURT NICHOLS briefed over the faculty compensation options. (EXHIBIT A)

REP. BENGTSON moved to have Eastern Iontana College moved up to the $93 \%$ level for the biennium. MOTION FAILED on a tie vote with three, REP. THOPT, REP. DONALDSON; And SENATOR NELSON opposing.

REP. THOFT moved to use the current level guideline for all six units. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

CRITICAL AREA ADJUSTMENT was the next area of discussion.
REP. THOFT moved to use the critical area adjustment for all six units. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSIY.

COMDUTERS
The committee discussed the computer requests made by Eastern, University of Montana, and Montana Tech. (EXHIBIT B)

REP. THOFT moved to appropriate $\$ 400,000$ to Eastern Montana college for $F Y$ 82; $\$ 175,000$ to the University of Montana for FY 82; and \$175,000 to Montana Tech for FY 83 for Computer Equipment. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

CURT NICHOLS stated that the primary problem with revenues is estimated indirect costs.

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SENATOR NELSON moved to accept the Commissioner's allocation of $\$ 1,000,000$ reduction of revenue estimates. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

CONTINGENCY FUNDS
REP. THOFT moved to table the Contingency Funds at this time. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

## SPECIAL EDUCATION

The next discussion was in regard to the Audiological Services in Special Education. The Department of Public Health felt they could carry on the duties the second year of the biennium and for the first year the Office of Public Instruction would still contract with the schools. The General Fund would be appropriated to the Office of Public Instruction.

REP. BENGTSON moved to put the $\$ 688,614$ for $F Y 82$ and $\$ 750,589$ for FY 83 for the Audiological Services into the Office of Public Instruction's budget. MOTION FASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

COOPERATIVE EXTEINSION SERVICE
The Extension Service's salaries were discussed in regard to the catch-up.

REP. BENGTSON moved to accept the $\$ 186,808$ for Salary Catch-Up for the Extension Service. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLy.

Meeting recessed at 8 a.m.
Meeting reconvened at 12:30 p.m.
AGRICULTURAL EXPERIMENT STATION
The Agricultural Experiment Station salary base increases were discussed. (EXHIBIT C)

CURT NICHOLS explained several adjustments that could be made.
REP. BENGTSON moved to accept the $\$ 61,942$ for $F Y 82$ and $\$ 61,942$ for $F Y$ 33, a total of $\$ 123,884$ for Salary Base increases for the Agricultural Experiment Station.

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CURT NICHOLS explained that to raise the average salaries in the Experiment Station to the level of Montana State University would cost \$76,000.

SENATOR HAFFEY made a substitute motion to adopt the adjusted average compensation to equal guidelines for Montana State University currently for $\$ 76,713$ for $\operatorname{FY} 82$ and $\$ 75,713$ for FY 83 for Salary Base increases for the Agricultural Experiment Station. A total of $\$ 153,426$ for the biennium. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY with SENATOR JACOBSON absent as excused.

## BUREAU OF MINES

The committee discussed the salary adjustment for the Bureau of Mines. It was decided that the Bureau was up to their peer level with Montana Tech.

The committee also discussed the Mineral Economist Study which was approved and whether or not it should be funded.

REP. BENGTSON moved to not fund the Mineral Economist Study for the Bureau of Mines. MOTION EATIED, five to one with REP. BENGTSON affirmative.

DESIGNATED FUNDS
CURT NICHOLS explained the Designated Accounts for the Universities. It has been a recommendation of the last committee that these be appropriated.

GLEN LEAVITT stated that the Executive does not recommend appropriating the designated accounts.

REP. BENGTSON moved to not appropriate the Designated Accounts of the Universities. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

SMITH - LEVER
The committee discussed the Smith-Lever Funds for the Cooperative Extension Service. (EXHIBIT D)

CUPT NICHOLS stated that he would recommend a reversion clause if the committeee chooses to the conservative estimate,

REP. BENGTSON moved that the committee accept the LFA recommendation for $\$ 1,561,193$ for $F Y 82$ and $\$ 1,570,477$ for $F Y 83$ Unrestricted Smith-Lever Fund estimates. MOTION PASSED UMADIMOUSLY.

BUTTE VO-TECF SUMMER SCHOOL

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The committee discussed the Butte Vo-Tech Summer School Program.
JOHN BEBEE, Fiscal Analyst, gave a handout with program priorities and the estimated cost and FTE level. (EXFIBIT E)

SENATOR JACOBSON moved to accept the four top priorities: Practical Nursing, Business, Welding and Electrical Technology for the Butte Summer School programs to be funded in FY 83. MOTION FAILED on a tie vote, with three, REP, THOFT, REP, DONALDSON, and SENATOR NELSON opposing.

SENATOR JACOBSON moved to appropriate $\$ 50,698$ for FY 83 for two programs for the Butte Vo-Tech Summer School. MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.
