#### EXECUTIVE SESSION MINUTES OF THE MEETING SENATE LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE February 18, 1981

The meeting of the Local Government Committee was called to order by Chairman George McCallum at 7:30 p.m. on the above date in Room 405.

ROLL CALL: All members were present with Senators O'Hara, Conover and Ochsner coming in late due to other meetings.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 50: Senator McCallum said the subcommittee decided on two different bases. One is for first through third class counties. They would receive a \$14,000 base and \$10 per 100 population increments. The other is for fourth through seventh class counties. They would receive a \$12,000 base and \$20 per 100 population increments. If this does not give them a raise they would get a 7% increase, whichever is more. Instead of giving them 100% of the CPI, we gave them up That is to be decided by resolution of the county to 70%. commissioners on or before July 1 after 1981. All county attorney get the same regardless of class of county. Part-time county attorneys will receive half the full-time salary. Sheriffs will receive \$2,000 over the base. Part-time county commissioners are raised from \$40 to \$50 per day.

Senator Van Valkenburg asked if most part-time county attorneys are now compensated according to population and taxable valuation.

Senator McCallum said yes they are.

Senator Van Valkenburg said this would probably be a big jump for those in the small counties.

Senator McCallum agreed.

Senator Van Valkenburg said if you give them a raise of \$6,000 in the small counties and a county attorney in a large county receives \$600, that is not going to go over very well.

Senator Hammond said on the base formula the raise is better than 7%, except in smaller counties.

Senator Van Valkenburg asked how the subcommittee decided on the 7% figure.

Senator McCallum said they felt everyone should get a raise and this is setting guidelines for the future. If the population didn't bring them up to 7%, we threw in the 7% figure. They will receive whichever is greater.

Senator O'Hara said he thinks the attorneys should get a little better.

Senator McCallum said he does not object to that but they have gotten a lot of heat off the county attorneys' salaries. The county attorney is furnished an office, staff and law books. He doesn't know if we could get it through any higher.

Senator Van Valkenburg asked if with the 7% figure in the bill, are the county attorneys going to receive a 7% increase.

Senator McCallum said no they are not but they are the highest paid elected official.

Senator Van Valkenburg said the provision on page 9, lines 6 through 10 would give the county attorney a raise of 7% over the current \$34,346.

Senator McCallum said that would amount to a \$2,403 raise which would amount to a total salary of \$36,750.

Senator Van Valkenburg said that provision would give them a raise. The 7% figure is fine. He would like to see what the fisca impact would be on the state.

Senator McCallum said he was more concerned with the impact on the counties.

John Scully said he figures it would be a \$3,000 raise for parttime.

Senator McCallum said if the formula is left as is and the population and base would not bring them up, the 7% would.

Senator Van Valkenburg agreed to that. He asked why the subcommitt settled on the \$10 figure for first through third class counties. Did you try to use \$15 to see what it would do.

Senator McCallum said the salary commission worked with \$10 for quite a while. In Yellowstone County the \$15 would be too much, it would raise salaries to about \$30,000.

Senator Hammond said these would be very healthy raises from the old law to the proposed new law. They are all \$2,000 or better.

Senator Van Valkenburg asked about sheriffs, coroners and superintendents.

Senator McCallum said the superintendents are getting \$400 over the base.

Senator Van Valkenburg asked about the sheriffs' increment being decreased from \$5,000 to \$2,000.

Senator McCallum said after last session they thought the sheriffs were getting \$2,000 above base. The Attorney General ruled they could only receive \$1,200 because that was a 7% increase.

Sheriff O'Reilly said they already had the \$1,200 but never got the additional \$800.

Senator Hammond said he does not like the \$400 for superintendents. Many counties are consolidating that office.

Senator Van Valkenburg said that is the law, we are not changing that any. The sheriffs' salary is the one that concerns him. He is worried about the deputies. He is afraid we will still have the 90% figure locking them in.

Senator McCallum said he was not arguing that but this bill is for elected officials.

Senator Van Valkenburg said if you don't raise the sheriffs' salary, the deputies will be locked in at the 90% level.

Senator Hammond said in Malta the sheriff will get a raise of \$6,000. He is happy with what it will do in Phillips, Blaine and Valley Counties.

Senator Hammond moved we accept the formula as we amended here tonight.

The motion passed unanimously, Senators Ochsner and O'Hara were excused.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 84: Senator Van Valkenburg said the Supreme Court came out with an order in December stating the number of copies they require for transcripts on appeal will be reduced. The folio rate has been based on what they would receive for each copy. They will be taking a cut in pay. Senator O'Hara suggested we give them what would be a token increase to 10 cents per folio. As far as their salary, give them a 7% increase.

Senator Hammond said he would rather go for the salary increase than the folio increase.

Senator McCallum said they are currently receiving a minimum of \$12,500 and a maximum of \$18,000. They want to raise that to a \$16,000 minimum and a \$27,500 maximum.

Senator Thomas suggested a minimum of \$14,000 and maximum of \$20,000.

Senator Van Valkenburg suggested a 10% increase to make up for the folio then.

Senator Hammond said if we raise it by \$2,000 on each end the judge would have room to work with it.

Senator Thomas moved the minimum be raised to \$14,000 and the maximum be raised to \$20,000. The motion carried unanimously.

Senator Thomas said on page 2, line 5, we are striking travel. He moved we put travel back in for necessary travel expenses. That motion carried unanimously.

Senator Van Valkenburg moved SB84 DO PASS as amended. The motion carried unanimously, Senator O'Hara was excused.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 121: Senator Van Valkenburg said the filing fee is what he is really complaining about. He is not sure what else they are doing here. He made a motion to reduce the \$40 figure on page 1, lines 14 and 15, to \$25.

Senator Hammond said he does not go for the bill at all.

Senator McCallum asked if \$10 was all right on page 1, line 20.

Senator Van Valkenburg said yes.

Senator Van Valkenburg's motion carried with all but Senator Hammond agreeing and Senator O'Hara being excused.

Senator Hammond moved SB121 DO NOT PASS. The motion carried with all but Senator Thomas voting aye and Senator O'Hara being excused.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 175: Senator Van Valkenburg moved to amend SB175 by striking 17 on line 16 and inserting 10 cents. The amendments passed unanimously.

Senator Van Valkenburg moved SB175 DO PASS as amended. The motion carried unanimously, Senator O'Hara was excused.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 177: The motion was made that the word "shall" on page 1, line 23 be changed to "may". Also on page 4, line 16 to raise \$25,000 to \$40,000.

Senator Hammond moved DO PASS as amended.

Senator Ochsner moved SB177 DO NOT PASS.

Senator Hammond withdrew his motion.

Senator Thomas thought the sheriff acting as county rural fire chief was a good idea.

Senator McCallum said if we kill this bill, we will be going back to having someone designated as chief of the rural fire districts.

Sheriff O'Reilly said he was ordered not to fight structure fires in non-district areas. This would have cleared that up.

Senator Ochsner's motion carried with all in favor except Senators Hammond and O'Hara.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 215: Senator O'Hara said he thinks we should raise the fees. He is for charging the people creating the problem.

The following amendments were suggested: Page 1; line 15 strike \$10 and insert \$5, line 22 strike \$10 and insert \$5, line 25 strike \$1 and insert \$2.50. Page 2; line 3 strike \$10 and insert \$5, line 5 strike \$10 and insert \$7, line 7 strike \$10 and insert \$5, line 9 strike \$10 and insert \$5, line 11 strike 50 cents and insert 25 cents, line 14 strike everything through \$2 and insert \$5, line 18 strike \$15 and insert \$7.50.

Senator O'Hara moved the bill DO PASS as amended.

Senator Van Valkenburg asked about the last line whereby the fees must be credited by the county treasurer to the sheriff's budget.

Senator McCallum said it has to be reappropriated if it is not a revolving fund.

Senator O'Hara's motion carried unanimously.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 343: Senator Hammond moved the bill DO PASS as amended. The motion carried unanimously.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 354: Senator Conover moved the bill DO PASS. The motion carried unanimously, Senator O'Hara was excused.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 359: Senator McCallum said there were two parts that bothered him. The resolutions could be proposed one right after the other, there is no restriction there. Also, you are doing away with the petition proposition.

The committee decided to let the bill sit.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 362: Senator Van Valkenburg moved the bill DO PASS. Senators Ochsner and Hammond were opposed, Senator O'Hara was excused, all others voted aye.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 379: Senator Thomas moved we table the bill.

There was no further discussion on the bill.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 48: Senator Hammond motioned the bill DO PASS. The motion carried unanimously, Senator O'Hara was excused.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 442: Senator Van Valkenburg moved the bill DO PASS as amended. The motion carried unanimously, Senator O'Hara was excused.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 451: Senator Van Valkenburg moved we table the bill. The motion carried unanimously, Senator O'Hara was excused.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 167: Senator Van Valkenburg moved the bill DO NOT PASS. The motion carried unanimously, Senator O'Hara was excused.

DISPOSITION OF SENATE BILL NO. 131: Senator Hammond moved the bill DO PASS as amended. The motion carried unanimously.

There being no further business before the committee, the meeting was adjourned at 9:45 p.m.
